District Missional/Renewal Commission holds Conversations About Race Relations

Recent current events and news stories around such topics as racial justice, white privilege, equality/equity, etc. have spurred conversations within the Missional/Renewal Commission. As a result, in an effort to increase understanding within the district, a task team has been formed. Denominational Compelling Vision Bible Study

The Compelling Vision Team is developing a 13-session Bible study series around the Compelling Vision. Designed for use by youth and adults, the series will be available at no cost on the Compelling Vision webpage in February 2021. (Sample sessions will be posted in mid-January.) Recognizing the importance of discerning the mind of Christ through communal study of scripture, it is our hope that this Bible study series will serve a twofold purpose: to help congregations engage more deeply with the Jesus in the Neighborhood vision and to help congregations and their delegates prepare for the conversations to take place at Annual Conference as we move toward affirmation of the vision. Each of the thirteen sessions has as its focus a question that invites participants to explore a different word or phrase in the vision and has been written by a different person, creating a series that is rich in both breadth and depth. The project is being edited by Joan Daggett. Plans are also underway to translate this resource into both Spanish and Haitian Kreyol. Moderator's Town Hall "Faith, Science, and COVID-19, Part Three" Slated for January 21,

Church of the Brethren Annual Conference Moderator Paul Mundey has announced plans for the next Moderator's Town Hall on January 21, 2021, at 7:00 PM EST. The topic will be "Faith, Science, and COVID-19, Part Three." Dr. Kathryn Jacobsen will once again be the featured resource person.

The Town Hall will center on current trend lines related to the COVID-19 crisis along with relevant topics such as the rollout of vaccines to alleviate the pandemic. A special focus will be the role of churches in response to the crisis, as the faith community is called to grapple with the realities of both faith and science.

Dr. Kathryn Jacobsen is Professor in the Department of Global and Community Health at George Mason University, Fairfax, Virginia. Dr. Jacobsen is a specialist in infectious disease epidemiology and global health who has consulted with several organizations during this pandemic. She is also a member of the Oakton Church of the Brethren, Oakton, Virginia, valuing her connection to faith and the Church of the Brethren.

Southern Ohio/Kentucky Disaster Ministries Updates

2020 Data – This year has presented unique challenges for S. Ohio/KY BDM due to the impact of COVID -19. Initially rebuilding trips were cancelled, but then new protocols were developed and put in place. There were 13 rebuilding trips with 89 volunteers. These trips were to North Carolina and Dayton, Ohio at a cost of \$2,500. Prior to the BDM site moving to Dayton, S. Ohio/KY volunteers repaired three tornado damaged homes at a cost of \$5,000. For Church World Service (CWS), 1,008 Cleanup Buckets and 1,084 School Kits were assembled for \$24,000. At six Sewing Bees, 40 participants sewed bags for school kits or prepped items for buckets/kits. This year we were unable to work at the Brethren Service Center processing CWS kits or to send volunteers to care for children through Children's Disaster Services. Support was given in many forms: as a rebuilding volunteer, assembling CWS kits, financial contributions, and prayer. All are greatly appreciated as together we bring hope and share God's love with disaster survivors. **2021 Rebuilding Trips** – Volunteers are needed for rebuilding trips throughout 2021. The current site is in Bayboro, NC, and the site in Dayton, OH will reopen in April. Volunteers need to be at least fifteen years old, unless they go with a parent or guardian, and then they may be fourteen. Expenses are covered, and transportation is provided. COVID-19 procedures are in place during travel, at the housing site, and at the work site. BDM works hard at serving disaster survivors and keeping volunteers safe.
