# **Denominational Compelling Vision Bible Study**

The Compelling Vision Team is developing a 13-session Bible study series around the Compelling Vision. Designed for use by youth and adults, the series will be available at no cost on the Compelling Vision webpage in February 2021. Recognizing the importance of discerning the mind of Christ through communal study of scripture, it is our hope that this Bible study series will serve a two-fold purpose: to help congregations engage more deeply with the Jesus in the Neighborhood vision and to help congregations and their delegates prepare for the conversations to take place at Annual Conference as we move toward affirmation of the vision. Each of the thirteen sessions has as its focus a question that invites participants to explore a different word or phrase in the vision and has been written by a different person, creating a series that is rich in both breadth and depth.

Looking back on 2020, we realize that it has been a rough year for everyone. Yet the work of Jesus in the Southern Ohio/Kentucky District continues. Our 2020 virtual District conference theme, Ambassadors for Christ reminded us again who we are and what we are about as a district with first-person videos, inspiring worship, reports that inform the person in the pew, and challenging questions that seek future answers. With the conference theme still ringing in our ears, the Resource and Development Commission of our District Board is inviting you to join us along with the district staff and board and conference delegates in making a direct contribution to "The Ambassadors for Christ Club". This fund was established to help underwrite the varied ministries of our district in 2021.

One of the ministries SOKD has valued over the years is our Camping and Retreat Ministry. This ministry has continued to flourish during the pandemic, even though gathering at a camp and spending time together has not been possible. Here is what Susan Fitze from our Trotwood congregation shares about the 2020 Virtual Women's Retreat:

After months of pandemic isolation, more than forty women joyfully gathered via zoom for the annual Woman's Retreat in the Fall of 2020. We came from throughout the Southern Ohio/Kentucky District of the Church of the Brethren – and beyond, as far away as Montana! The theme this year was prayer. We came hungry for a deeper understanding and commitment to prayer, and also for fellowship with our sisters in Christ. Four members of the planning committee each presented a different method of prayer: adoration, confession, thanksgiving and supplication, offering fresh thoughts, ideas and insights about each. Then, through the wonders of technology, we were divided into groups of 3-5 women for discussion around the same. Deep conversations, fresh insights, open conversations, support and just plain fun happened in these small groups. We all came together again for a closing worship which challenged us to stay connected through prayer and at the same time widen our table to welcome friends, neighbors, strangers. Bread and cup communion was shared. Each woman provided her own version of the bread (crackers, cookies) and cup (water, tea, juice), and we were reminded that we are the bread and cup to those we meet and to the wider world. As we said good-bye, we left with both deeply personal experiences and encompassing connections, through prayer and fellowship, with each other and with our God.

- May we remember those congregations in pastoral transition - Sandy Jenkins has ended her service as pastor for the **Constance** congregation. The congregation is exploring a yoked arrangement with Cincinnati with the Cincinnati pastors providing leadership for the next few months.
