"I have lived my whole life around the Southern Ohio Kentucky District. I was born into the West Alexandria Church of the Brethren, with a baby dedication as an infant and baptism at thirteen. My first participation in district events was attending church camp at Woodland Altars with several years at Performing Arts Camp. In junior high and high school, I attended district youth events. These events in my life served as learning experiences of how other teens felt and experienced God and summer camp reunions.

"The district was there for me in my darkest hours, I was cut from the varsity basketball team, while being recruited for basketball by several regional colleges. My youth leader Nan Erbaugh suggested, I go to the District Fall Youth Rally the following weekend. My emotional outlook on myself and life changed that weekend. I became part of the District Youth Cabinet and met a mentor, who I still hold in my heart to this day.

"As I moved into my college years, the district was there for me again. My plan as a summer research fellow did not happen and I needed a summer job. I knew I did not want to work retail, on a farm, or secretarial jobs. The suggestion came, "be full time staff at Woodland Altars for the summer." That summer was wonderful and challenging. I learned to face fears by crawling through caves--that I can be calm in emergency situations-- and others got to know God through my words and actions.

"After college, I moved to Cincinnati. I was a single woman, living in an apartment alone, knowing only a few people in a new city. I was encouraged to seek out the Cincinnati congregation. At the time, the church was just a small fellowship, meeting in a fellowship hall of another church. I found another supportive community. Ben and Kristen Walters welcomed me into the church. From their own travels, they knew the struggles of being on your own in a new place. I became active in the church from reading scripture, telling children's stories, to setting up and tearing down after church. I even preached a sermon as the pastor and a few of the men from church ran in the Flying Pig Marathon. "I moved to Columbus for a new job, I found a new community in the Living Peace congregation. Being a part of Living Peace, I saw others being active in the district and helped with hosting district meetings at the church. When I was asked by members of my church to be on the District Board, I knew I had to say yes. This is my third year on the district board and member of the Resource and Development Committee. I am excited for the opportunities that lay ahead for the district. I want others to find this district as supportive as I have." -- A testimony by Sarah Friedrich

They are gathering items to provide a comfortable living space. They are in need of a coffee table, 2 twin size mattresses and bed frames, a queen size mattress pad, and 2 twin mattress pads. It would be wonderful if a Sunday School class or a congregation would want to cover the monthly wi-fi \$55 fee, or perhaps pledge an amount monthly toward food and toiletries. One time gifts are also welcome. If there is someone with carpentry skills, they need help to repair a fire wall door for the living space. Jennifer Keeney Scarr has resigned as pastor of the **Trotwood** congregation, her last Sunday of service will be July 11. I am working with Trotwood leadership on transition. Nan Erbaugh has announced her retirement as pastor of the **Lower Miami** congregation for later this summer; I am working with Lower Miami leadership with their transition.

- There are many issues and situations continuing to face us as we minister in our respective locations, including those who are serving in interim situations and others who are in discernment regarding placement or are considering a move. There are others facing health issues, please keep these situations in prayer.
