Southern Ohio/Kentucky Disaster Ministries Updates

Ice Cream Social – The annual Ice Cream Social Fundraiser will be held on Saturday, August 7, 4:00 – 7:00 PM at Happy Corner COB. Come for supper, pie, ice cream, and fellowship! There will be musical entertainment in the sanctuary for your enjoyment before and after you eat. Sewers will be making school bags for CWS school kits. Bring your sewing machine and an extension cord. Non-sewers will be preparing items for CWS cleanup buckets and school kits. Lower Miami Church of the Brethren has been matched with a family of four from Honduras--parents and two sons, ages 7 and 12. They could arrive within a few weeks. They were in the citizenship process in the US more than a year ago and even had a sponsor in Michigan when the government changed the policy and sent them back to Mexico to wait. The new administration has changed the policy back, so they are working their way through the system again. Tim and Katie Heishman have announced their resignation as pastors of the Prince of Peace congregation for later this summer; I am working with **Trotwood** leadership on their pastoral transition with hopes of making arrangements with an interim pastor soon. Nan Erbaugh has announced her retirement as pastor of the Lower Miami congregation for later this summer; I am working with Lower Miami leadership with their transition. **Eversole** has entered the pastoral search process with hopes to call someone to serve alongside current pastor Mark Bowman as he approaches retirement late next year and then for the newly called person to begin service as the senior pastor. Barb Sayler has announced her resignation as pastor at **Beavercreek** to accept a call to be a chaplain in a retirement community. She will not be moving from their current home.
- There are many issues and situations continuing to face us as we minister in our respective locations, including those who are serving in interim situations and others who are in discernment regarding placement or are considering a move. There are others facing health issues, please keep these situations in prayer.
