Woodland Altars Chalet News and Updates

Mother Nature has challenged all of us this winter. The same weather patterns hit Woodland Altars just like the entire Miami Valley. During the coldest days at the camp, many pipes in the chalets were frozen and burst. Winterizing them had not happened because people were using them into January.

The burst pipes caused damage in Chalets 1, 3, and 5. Chalet 1 received the greatest damage, because the whole first floor was flooded. When professional restoration team members were about to remove the saturated insulation in the crawl space, a bat infestation in hibernation was discovered. The bats presence prevented any work in the area to be continued until they leave naturally.

Luckily, Woodland Altars has good insurance. Much of the damage was covered by our policy. However, not all the replacement and work needed to be done was insured. An example would be the kitchen cabinets in Chalet 1. While the ruined, lower cabinets would be replaced by the insurance, the top, hanging cabinets above were not damaged. The countertop and sink also came through unharmed. Yet if we only replace the lower kitchen cabinets, the appearance of the chalet would be drastically compromised.

The CRC has made some decisions about the renovations to be made in the chalets where pipes were burst. Not using the money from the insurance company would be foolish. Since the insurance would only cover about half of the costs, the CRC felt going ahead with the renovations was going to be beneficial to the camp and all who come for a stay in the chalets. The extra renovation costs would come from the district and donations people send.

The following is a short list of the most important renovations taking place. The three first floor bathrooms will receive new flooring, low flow toilets, vanities, sinks, and faucets and a new coat of paint. Chalets 1 and 5 will have new flooring in the kitchens and main living areas. The three chalets will also have their entrances updated. Chalet 1 kitchen cabinets will all be replaced with a new countertop. The sink and faucet are still good enough to be placed back into the new counter. Some other minor repairs to ceilings and walls would also be completed.

The CRC has made a commitment to keep the chalets open from now until after the hunting season next fall. This means people can rent the chalets for weeks, weekends, family reunions, special getaways, and time away from the demands of daily life. We are encouraging interested groups or individuals to contact the camp to set up reservations. Rates are as follows:
