

## **161<sup>st</sup> District Conference Wrap-up**

Our 161st conference is now a part of Southern Ohio District's history.

This year's delegates made three important decisions:

1. Accepted two offers for Camp Woodland Altars: One from the Nature Conservance for 1.2 Million for the Wooded acreage and one from Tom Partin for approximately \$300,000.00 for the developed acreage. Detailed information will be publicized once the surveying is completed.
2. The budget presented by the District Board was accepted. During the upcoming year, listening sessions will be held as we discern what God's vision for our district is and how each of us is being called to participate.
3. As a district we will enter into a time of reconciliation which will be guided by a professional organization that specializes in this sort of work.
