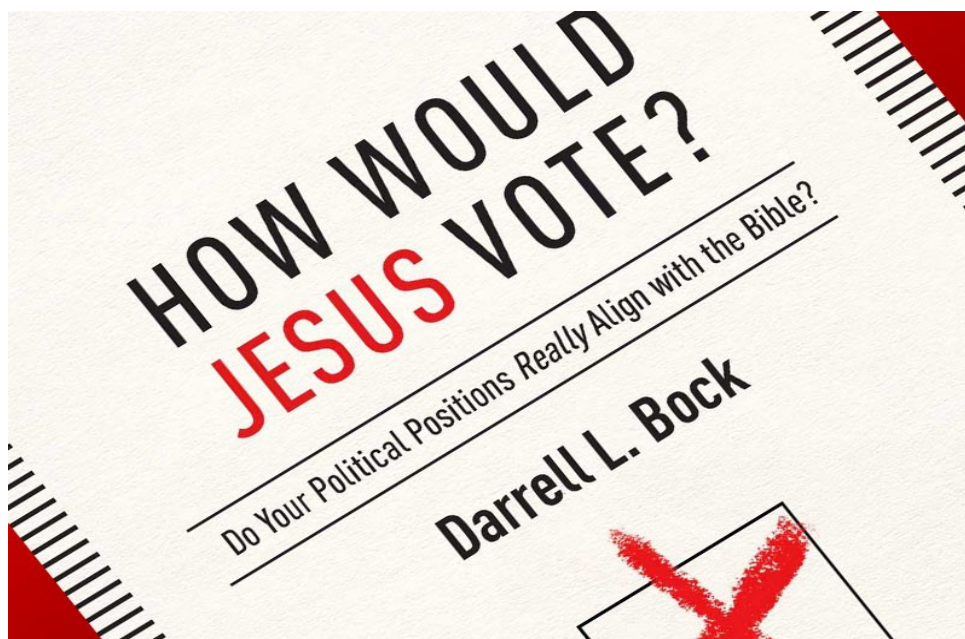

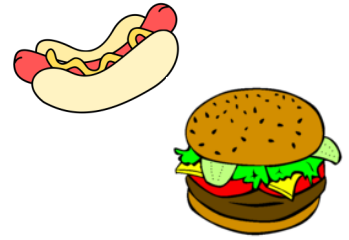

News from our: **Lutheran Women's Missionary League**

A look in the rearview mirror --

Though women's groups organized in congregations soon after the Saxon founders of the Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod arrived in the United States in 1839, often under the name of 'The Ladies Aid', & after 10+ years of dialog & planning between Synod's leaders & women representatives from different districts, LWML held its organizing convention at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in Chicago on July 7 & 8, 1942. Rev. J. W. Behnken was president of the Synod & Mrs. Otto Schmitt was elected the 1st LWML president.

Texas District LWML---A bit of history:

The TX District LWML commemorated the 50th anniversary of LWML by establishing a \$50,000 **Scholarship Endowment** the income of which is used to provide scholarships for female members of the Texas District attending LCMS colleges preparing for fulltime church careers. Approximately \$73,000 has been awarded for scholarships since 1992. In 1998 a Mission In-Reach Endowment was established, interest to be used for Leadership training & spiritual growth opportunities. At present interest will be used to help fund the biennial Zone Presidents Orientation. In 2003 the District launched a campaign to raise a million dollars through estate-planned &/or cash gifts by June, 2017--the 75th anniversary of LWML, funds to be added to the principles of the 2 established endowments referred to above. The donor chooses which endowment shall be the recipient--the total amount given may be divided between the 2. At present the estimate amount towards the million dollars is over \$650,000. Zones & societies are encouraged to put forth an effort towards this 75th Anniversary Campaign before year's end. You, the members of this church family have been FANTASTIC SUPPORTERS OF LWML!!! You bring coats, health kit items, hot dogs & buns, food for funerals, prayers, & on & on! You're very much aware what we attempt to accomplish here with the Lord's guidance & blessing. There was a brief list in the Reporter couple of years ago, of Interesting Facts on LCMS Partners.

LWML is an auxiliary of the LCMS. This article stated that the LWML has provided more than **\$100 million** for Christian outreach at home & during its 72-year history. That's a hunk of change & the money funded items that wouldn't have been funded otherwise. God continues to bless us so abundantly!

Holy Cross LWML is planning a door thank offering for Sunday, Oct 2 towards the 75th Anniversary Campaign.

Our big mite box will be available in the Narthex along with offering envelopes if anyone is moved to participate. Thank you & we pray God's richest blessings for each of you!!

Trash to Cash--stamps

Oh you heard my speech so often you may confuse me with all those campaign segments—but, please don't! Soon you will see the official amount so far from this project. I will tell you it is over \$30,000. Keep your eyes on the bulletin board in the Narthex. I'd like to share just one of my special finds while doing this project. I don't know who? But, I received 3 envelopes with what I'm sure was someone's collection. To that person it was a big gift to "Stamps for Mission". I am serious when I said "one" stamp is as valued as a bunch. I still keep the picture in my mind of "save one penny & one plus many more equal a dollar". This saving & collecting of stamps for Missions, has been great therapy for me. 1. Trimming stamps has 3 effects: a. keeps me from snacking, b. relaxing, & c. great therapy for stiff joints. 2. It has taken my imagination many miles, special events, & the art work is fascinating. 3. Show & Tell—I enjoy showing them to my husband. There's so much we all take for granted. Note: On "Postcards" we will not trim stamps from the cards. There are now Postcard collectors of a time past. When was the last post card you sent?!? We take stamps. Yes, some end up in the trash, but you never know. If you do trim the stamp remember 1/4" around the stamp is the minimum & never separate stamps.

27,000 stamps equals approximately a pound, April 2—you sent 22 lbs—594,000, June 8—you sent 7 lbs—216,000

In a few weeks another package goes. "All money" is used for mailing health kits to devastated area. Just leave your items in the Narthex mailbox of **Sharon Teinert** or **Judy Alvarez** or you may leave in the church office.

End Times

Sign up on clipboard sheets in August if **YOU** would like to join in this venture of an in-depth study of the “End Times”.

LifeLight course is designed for adults

(mid-to-older teens might also be LifeLight participants)

who desire a deeper study of Scriptures.

LifeLight does not assume or require an existing knowledge of the Bible or special experience or skills in Bible study. However,

It does assume a level of commitment that will bring participants to each of the nine weekly assemblies **having read the assigned readings and attempted to answer the study questions.** Each week has five (5) lessons.

It takes 20-30 minutes to complete one day’s lesson.

Doing one lesson a day makes it manageable.

Each individual life certainly comes to a conclusion. But what about the whole thing? Is humanity doomed just to muddle along as it has in the past? Or is there a goal, a final reckoning, an ending that makes sense? Christians believe not only that the world had a beginning (Creation) and a glorious middle (our Lord’s death and resurrection), but that it will also have an end.

But day after day, year after year, generation after generation, the world goes on as it has in the past. The narratives of the Bible may inspire us; the truths of our faith may encourage us; but we long for the promised ending, the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting. Without it, even the Christian “story” makes no sense. Over the course of 9 sessions, this study explores what the Bible has to say about the end times and what the divine Author has prepared, which is far greater than any of us could write or imagine, for His story ends in glory—the glory of Jesus’ return and the resurrection of God’s faithful into that glory forever.

- Session 7: The Last Day—Matthew 24:29–31
- Session 8: Signs of the Times—Matthew 24:3–28

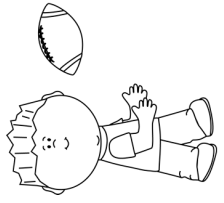
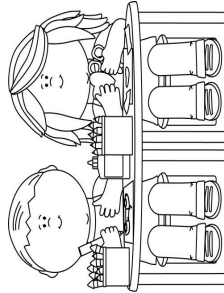


