#### Pastor Craig Schinnerer—Our Intentional Interim Pastor

Reverend Craig Schinnerer, the son of a Lutheran pastor, was born and spent his grade school years in southern California. His high school years were spent in Phoenix, Arizona, after which he attended California Lutheran College (University) in Thousand Oaks California, graduating in 1979 with a Bachelor's of Arts degree summa cum laude in Philosophy. He attended Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, graduating first in his class in 1983 after a vicarage at Concordia Lutheran Church in San Antonio, Texas. Upon ordination, Rev. Schinnerer was the founding pastor of and served Cross of Christ Lutheran Church, DeSoto, Texas, which grew to over 900 members in his eighteen-year tenure as pastor. He served his second congregation, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Azle, Texas, for sixteen years. During both of his previous callings he served long terms as circuit counselor/visitor, and it was in this capacity that he was called to help a number of congregations experiencing transitional challenges and crises. After completing training at Concordia Seminary in intentional interim ministry (see next page) in 2016, Rev. Schinnerer served eighteen months as intentional interim pastor for Grace Lutheran Church in Brownwood, Texas, when her pastor resigned suddenly. Craig and Christina (Tina) Schinnerer celebrate thirty-two years of marriage this Valentine's Day. Tina works part-time for American Airlines at DFW airport. They have been blessed with three children: Hannah (a 2015 graduate of Concordia University Texas who lives and works in Austin); Lydia (a senior biology student at Texas A&M University who serves as a part-time ministry staff member of University Lutheran Chapel); and Joseph (a freshman at University of Texas Dallas, studying computer Science, also a seconddegree black belt in Tae Kwon Do). All three of the Schinnerer offspring are musical, playing instruments and singing in their respective Missouri Synod congregations. Because of the nature of intentional interim ministry and the needs of his extended family (mother-in-law), Pastor and Tina will continue to maintain their home in Fort Worth while he "commutes" to Nederland with an apartment here, with an initial plan generally to be in town all of Sunday-Wednesday with extended daily work hours (usually twelve hours each day) before returning to Fort Worth after Holy Cross's Wednesday night ministries. However, he will always be available for any urgent needs of pastoral care. Our new pastor loves his daily devotions in Hebrew and Greek, participating and watching all kinds of sports, classic movies and good novels, cooking for his family . . . And he always carries a fly rod in the trunk of his car!

#### INTENTIONAL INTERIM MINISTRY

Intentional Interim Ministry has been around for decades and formally recognized by the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod for many years. More and more of the synod's districts are using trained intentional interim ministers in various situations. Formal training for intentional interim pastors involves two weeks of intensive study at the seminary, with an intervening sixmonth phase applying this learning in a ministry situation. (After serving two such interims, pastors can be "certified" by the National Association of Lutheran Interim Pastors.) Intentional Interim Ministry is especially to be considered when a congregation 1) has had a pastor of long tenure or when a senior pastor leaves a large congregation with multiple ministry staff members, 2) when a pastor leaves a church in significant conflict or other crises, 3) when a pastor dies or leaves suddenly, 4) after a pastor who has transgressed sexual, financial, or other ethical boundaries, 5) when a congregation is dying, and/or 6) simply when a church needs new focus on her mission and vision.

The intentional interim pastor functions fully (usually fulltime) as the called shepherd of the congregation, providing all essential pastoral services - preaching, teaching, catechesis, admonition and absolution, care of the sick and dying, administrative counsel, etc. At the same time, the special focus of his ministry is to lead the congregation into a more healthy and strong understanding of the church's past, her connections with the synod and district, the workings of present relationships in the church family system and leadership, and a unified vision for the future, especially with the goal of calling a more permanent pastor to shepherd God's people in this future. Accordingly, intentional interim ministers serve, usually with a detailed "contract" attached to their call, only for a limited and short time (typically no less than one year, no longer than two), with an inviolable understanding that they will not be considered for the permanent call of the congregation. One essential characteristic of the interim is the "stirring of the pot" the purposeful enabling of members of the church family to see themselves (first!) and the church from new perspectives and with new behaviors. Intentional Interim Ministry seeks to address the church's relationships and ministry issues acutely and quickly. A "transition team" is formed to study the congregation's past and present situations, then make recommendations to the church for her future and the call of her permanent pastor. The interim minister typically leaves the congregation just before the new pastor arrives and is installed.

Our LWML ladies will be preparing a meal for shut ins this month.


Prayer Card Ministry
