SPECIAL LENTEN MID-WEEK AND HOLY WEEK WORSHIP THIS MONTH!

If you want a truly deep Easter worship experience, be sure to be with us on Wednesday nights, on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, yes also every Sunday. Lent is a season of special penitence (repentance) and preparation . . . especially to gather at Christ's empty tomb on Easter morning! God's Spirit does this through the Word shared in your extended daily devotions and additional worship. Be with us for everything! . . .

Wednesday Night Lenten Worship – April 3 & April 10 at 7:30! Our worship series "At the Cross Roads" continues with a look at "Declaration" and "Obedience" . . . with the messages shared from our pulpit by two of Jesus's most prominent disciples! The Wednesday services are short (about 40 minutes) so that children can get home early on school nights. The pre-service atmosphere is more meditative and quiet – come early for personal prayer before the opening confessional hymn!

"Sunday of the Passion" – Sunday morning, April 14, at 10:30! "Holy Week" begins with a day devoted to pondering Christ's Passion ("suffering") as He enters Jerusalem on the first Palm Sunday. Our "Second Celebration" music transitions during the worship service from the loud shouts of children processing and singing "Hosanna!" . . . to the stark solemnity of Christ's suffering and death. A unique worship experience! Sunday School for all ages and Adult Bible Class at 9:00!

Maundy Thursday Communion – April 18... at both 2:00 in the afternoon and at 7:30 that night! The Lord's Supper on the day He instituted it! We'll use some special music by the Lutheran band Koiné around the Meal – don't miss this! "At the Crossroads" continues with the first of three final messages from three of the "Mary"s in the Bible. See you either at 2:00 or 7:30!

Good Friday "Tenebrae" – April 19... at both 2:00 in the afternoon and at 7:30 that night! We incorporate part of the ancient Tenebrae (Service of "Darkness") into a final installment of "At the Crossroads"... as we hear the thoughts of the mother of our Lord at His cross! Join us at either hour!

"Holy Saturday", April 20... The pastor will, as much as possible, open the sanctuary for your devotion time on the solemn day when Jesus's body lay in the grave. Special readings from the Old Testament used in the ancient "Easter Vigil" may be read at the top of each hour.

Easter Sunrise Worship – Sunday morning, April 21, at 6:45 on the lawn by the statue! Before the sun rises Easter morning we gather for a brief climax of our Lent worship series "At the Crossroads" . . . with someone who was there at sunrise the first Easter morning! Afterwards, we have a free muffin breakfast (offerings support our youth ministry) – see inside this newsletter! Join us also at 9:00 for Sunday School and Adult Bible Class (special Easter videos and more!), and then . . .

Holy Communion on "The Resurrection of Our Lord" – Sunday morning worship on April 21 at 10:30 on the highest feast on the church calendar! Processions and banners! Lilies and choir anthems! Triumphant Easter hymns with our full liturgy! We'll look for you! Bring family, friends, and enemies!

Are you a newcomer to Holy Cross Lutheran Church and wanting to get more involved in the congregation? Study our basic teachings in the Bible? Perhaps join as a communing member? This is for YOU!

Everyone in the congregation! You should review the "basics" of your Christian faith every seven years or so. (Think of how your life has changed from seven years ago!) Holy Cross Lutheran Church can only be stronger in Christ's grace and guidance when we are strong in the fundamentals of His Word!

We want everyone and anyone to attend Pastor Schinnerer's new Sunday morning "Adult Inquiry Class". Yes, it's the "confirmation class" whereby new Lutherans can join the church. But longtime Lutherans also need it. You'll get the opportunity to study things in the Bible especially important to Holy Cross Lutheran Church in this "transition year" between pastors . . . What makes us a "Lutheran" Church? What's the mission of the Church and individual followers of Jesus? Why do we have pastors and what should they be?

We provide all the materials, even a Bible if you don't have one. (BYOB, however – Bring Your Own Bible always in this church – to add notes and make God's Word "your own"!) There's no testing or graded homework, and you're never asked to read aloud or answer questions. Just come and listen . . . and grow in God's saving Truth!

It all starts Sunday morning, April 9, at 9:00 in the conference room. If you miss the first class or two, join us when you can. (We'll have make-up sessions.) Yes, we're planning the first class for both sides of the "conference room" in the main office area – seating for dozens! But we're hoping we'll need to move it to a larger room when more attend. Watch the publicity and look for signs on doors.

Invite family, friends, and enemies! Anyone can attend! There's never any obligation to join the church when you join the class, but it is the "next step" to getting more involved in the family of Holy Cross . . . for both newcomers and charter members!!!

By the way, if you physically cannot attend at all on Sundays, we're looking to start a "repeat" of the class on Wednesday nights in mid-May and through the summer. Everyone should be able to attend!

WHAT IS THE "TRIDUUM"?

"Holy Week" is a remembrance of the actual eight days our Lord spent in Jerusalem – the week He suffered, died on the cross, and rose from the dead. Also called "Passion Week", the days should be a special time of devotion to God's Word and prayer for a believer. We encourage you to have lengthened daily devotions this week and join us for all our special worship together. The hymnal (pp. xviii-xix) has special readings for every day this week. Holy Week ends with The Easter Triduum (or The Paschal Triduum) – the "three days" of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. There are historical orders for worship on these three days – Holy Communion on the night Jesus started it, The Tenebrae ("Darkness") on the day He died, and The Easter Vigil on the day His body lay in the tomb. Although we schedule corporate worship only on Thursday and Friday, we do try to keep our sanctuary open and silent for prayer on Holy Saturday – phone first to be sure!

A TYPICAL "INTENTIONAL INTERIM" YEAR

Here's a sketch of a typical year for intentional interim ministry. Please note, however, that circumstances in a particular congregation may alter this schedule in significant ways. For instance, if, during the "discovery" phase conducted by the Transition Team there are challenges in the church that are deeper or more complex than expected, that phase can be extended. The "call process" concluding the third phase can take much longer • than the minimum time, and some churches choose to use this extra time for additional tasks with the interim

pastor. Here's the shortest scenario! . .

Phase 1: Pastor's Orientation (first month)

Member visitations (pastoral care needs prioritized)

Community connections

Meetings with leaders and leadership groups

Study of meeting minutes and reports

Visits with individuals outside congregation

Phase 2: "Transition Team" (second through ninth months)

• Formation: appointed by pastor (endorsement by Church Council, Board of Elders, and/or voters), 9-12 members with

training the first six weeks

Mission Insite" and other reports

Interviews with church members (resources provided)

(Cottage) Meetings (small groups) ??? – three or four meetings with themed agendas

Report (to congregation and Call Committee) Phase 3: Call Committee (ninth month onward) Two members of Transition Team on committee

Guidance from interim pastor

"Pastor Profile Survey" (Texas District)Miscellaneous projects during the interim

Bible study & Catechesis: What studies should we plan (for Sundays or other times)?

What is the plan for catechesis of youth?

Timeline Chart? . . . members share evaluations ("like" or "dislike") of church's historic events
