### WHAT IS YOUR GIFT?

Perhaps you haven't spent much time, if any, pondering that question. God has given each of us at least one gift, though, and if even one of us does not use that gift, the Body of Christ suffers. Paul, in Ephesians 4:16 writes, *"From Him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work."* 

Christian stewards tend to have a lower opinion of themselves than they ought, denigrating their abilities and talents and even their financial capabilities. When we keep in mind that it is God Himself Who has chosen our gifts and blessed us materially, we realize that to belittle these gifts is to question God's wisdom and generosity. Again we read Paul's words, now from Romans 12:5, ". . . in Christ, we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others." He goes on to say that whatever our gifts are, we are to use them as effectively as we can.

Yes, it is the pastor's job to preach the Word and administer the Sacraments, but we, as stewards who have received the Great Commission from Matthew 28:19-20, are to be obedient also to Jesus' command to tell the Good News to the whole world.

Yes, there are those in your congregation who seem to have more abilities and talents than you, and there may be members who have more money than you – perhaps may even be very wealthy. Does that exempt you from the responsibility to serve or to give? By no means! In 2 Corinthians 9:7 we're commanded, *"Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."* Each one is to give and to give cheerfully – of his time, his talents, and his treasures. God looks at the size of the heart of the giver rather than at the size of his gift. *"For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have"* (2 Corinthians 8:12).

If you are not using your gifts, if you are not giving your money, if you are not sharing your time, then the Body of Christ suffers. We need each other and our individual gifts in order that we might carry out our responsibilities as stewards to the end that the name of Christ might be made known.

## MESSAGE FROM PASTOR SETH

#### A pondering thought from the Verge Network on Jesus and the Holy Spirit...

Jesus' ministry on earth began with the thundering approval and confirmation of his Father's voice, "This is my son whom I love, you bring me great joy!" And as it began for Jesus, so it begins for us. Because of the life, death and resurrection of Christ (the gospel) we too now live with our Father's approval and a new identity.

But the good news doesn't end there. We are not made new creations, given a new identity, and then shoved out the door and told to go and live this out under our own strength, power, and wisdom. God does not expect us to all of a sudden become perfect, super-Christians—always wise, always gentle, and loving miraculously overnight.

The Bible compares this new life to taking a walk, one step at a time, each new area of trust in God connected to the next, as God himself matures us on a journey in the footsteps of Jesus. As we believe more and more deeply what is now true of us in Christ, we experience that we have been made new, inside and out. It's God's work, not ours!

"It is God who enables us, along with you, to stand firm for Christ. He has commissioned us, and he has identified us as his own by placing the Holy Spirit in our hearts as the first installment that guarantees everything he has promised us."

We are not filled with an emotional feeling, a hunch, or more zing. We are filled with a person.

Sometimes we never pick up that Jesus' earthly ministry was guided completely by the Holy Spirit. We usually think, "Well, Jesus is both God and man, so he knows what's up and just does everything perfectly, naturally." Well, sort of...

It's true that Jesus is both God and man, and that he lived his life without ever sinning. But as a human, like you and me, he fully submitted to and was guided by the Spirit. His life is a picture of the perfect work of the Holy Spirit in man.

Jesus was born by the work of the Spirit; Jesus was led by the Spirit to suffer temptation and come out spotless; Jesus was empowered by the Spirit to do the ministry he did; Jesus was full of wisdom and knowledge by the Holy Spirit; Jesus spoke only the words given him by the Spirit; Jesus was raised from the dead by the power of the Spirit.

Wouldn't it be great if we had this same Spirit living inside of us, guiding, empowering, and giving us words to say (or not say)?

Oh, wait! We do.

"The Spirit of God, who raised Jesus from the dead, lives in you. And just as God raised Christ Jesus from the dead, he will give life to your mortal bodies by this same Spirit living within you."


The same power that guided Jesus' life and raised him from the dead now lives in us.


