### **ORDINARY TIME**

In the context of the liturgical year the term "ordinary" means "not seasonal." It is that part of the church year that lies outside the seasons of Lent-Easter and Advent-Christmas. In Ordinary Time, the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ not in one specific aspect but in all its aspects.

Ordinary Time in the Church's year occurs in two sections. The first part begins following the Christmas season. It lasts through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, and resumes after Pentecost. The Liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green.
