This spring and summer have been seasons of transition for all of us here at East Lake. Times like these are both exciting and challenging and the Staff Parish Relations Team would like to ensure that everyone in our church family understands the staffing changes we are putting in place as our church migrates from having both Senior and Associate Pastors, to a ministry model where Pastor Jay Kowalski will serve as our sole clergy person. We believe that it will be important for Pastor Jay to have staff members who can assist him with the many ministries and administrative functions that a church the size of ours includes. Our goal has been to provide the necessary staff to continue and grow our current ministries while being mindful of maintaining a balanced budget. We are confident that this plan will achieve both of those goals. Our new staffing plan includes the following positions:

Karen Gambrell will assume the role of Administrator of Church Operations on a full time basis and will oversee the day to day operations of personnel, finance, administrative and custodial support. She will act as Pastor Jay's right hand for non-ministry functions.

Lucy McGee will assume the part-time role of Congregational Development Coordinator and will assume many of the duties that Pastor Dionne performed with regard to Pathfinders. She will also work to integrate new members into the life of the church and will be responsible for the tasks associated with maintaining membership rolls.

Danielle Muller joined us in June to fill the position of Communications Coordinator which is the position Laurel Fortuna left last March. Danielle's role will be more focused on communication and will not include all the duties related to new members that Laurel used to perform.

We have advertised for the position of **Minister of Visitation** to have a ministry-focused staff person who will work with our Caregiving Ministry to include our Stephens Ministers. This person will help Pastor Jay reach out to our homebound, sick and hospitalized church members to ensure that our visitation ministry is all that we need it to be.

We have also advertised for a parttime **Receptionist** who will greet visitors, answer phones, schedule rooms and appointments and do other clerical and administrative tasks. We are currently seeking an experienced preschool leader to become the new **Director of our Young Days Preschool** as well. The position of Administrative Assistant for Child and Youth Ministries has been eliminated.


We hope you will join us in welcoming new staff members as they arrive and that you will congratulate both Karen and Lucy on their appointments to new and important roles at ELUMC.

#### Treasurer's Report by Stanley Johnson

Listed below are the highlights of our Year to Date financial performance through May.

Total income	318	348	342
Total expenses	-312	-330	-308
Net income (deficit)	6	18	34

Our year to date income of \$318K is less than budget by \$30K and less than last year by \$24K. We see a decline in non-pledge envelopes which is less than budget by \$30K and last year by \$22K.

Year to date expenses are less than budget by \$18K and over last year by \$4K. Year-to-date net income of \$6K is less than budget by \$12K and less than last year by \$28K.

Our job was to dig a foundation for a new building for them. The lot we had to dig on was 50 feet by 50 feet. Our first task was to take off all the top soil. We had shovels, gloves, wheelbarrows and our determination. We finished digging up the topsoil on day two. So next we began our task of digging a trench for the concrete to be poured in around the perimeter. The trench was quite deep and involved digging up heaps and heaps of clay. But we got it done by day three. Finally we had to put up wooden boards along the trench to hold in the concrete. We finished this right at the end of day four. What we accomplished in our 3 and a half days working in SC was what Team Effort had planned to take three and a half weeks. God was definitely at work in Myrtle Beach.




