Grace to you and peace in Jesus!

Tired from the long drive to Cloudhaven after Sunday services, I arrived just in time for supper. The following time was invested in a difficult series of meetings. Tensions were high, feelings somewhat raw, and communication difficult. We needed the Holy Spirit's intervention and discernment. We were slow to ask, relying on the flesh and our own perceptions. The Holy Spirit answered our prayers by Tuesday morning, bringing each of us to recognize that we were speaking out of our past experiences and pain. We were reacting out of those wounds rather than responding to the opportunities the Lord was inviting us to embrace. Thank you Lord.

Tuesday afternoon I looked for a solitary place to read the Scripture and pray. I came across a picnic table atop Apache Point (9,200 feet above sea level). The table was feet away from the lip of the ridge near Sacramento Peak in the Sacramento Mountains. Grabbing my walking stick and Bible, I made the short and easy walk to the table. As I climbed I was overwhelmed by the scene unfolding before me. The Tularosa Basin is 35 x 65 miles, some 5,000 feet below, the edges of the basin disappearing behind the surrounding ridges of the Sacramento's. At the far side of the basin is the White Sands National Monument. Just ½ mile north of where I was seated is the National Solar Observatory at Sunspot. The skies were partly sunny, and the wind rather calm. The temperature was 55 degrees F.

As I sat, opened my Bible and began to pray, I was aware of the Father's presence and blessing. He drew me to that place and that moment. As I drew near to Him, He was already drawing near to me. He is always present, but there are too many moments when I am unaware of Him, un-responsive and un-seeking. For two hours He bathed me in His presence and love, affirmed His concern and interest in all that we had experienced during our meetings just passed. Gratitude welled up; praise poured out of my heart and took form on my lips. The Lord reminded me He is always present and ready to intervene. All I need to do, all you need to do, is stop, draw near Him, and discover that He is with us.

Summer is pressing in. We will seek to 'escape' the daily routine for relaxing and refreshing moments. Those moments are available to us today, now, where we are, whatever we're doing, if we will only stop and draw near to Him. How the Father desires to pour more of His love into each of us. I pray that you won't wait "until then." And I pray that as you 'escape' you will find yourself resting in the arms of the Father. "Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen."

DIOCESAN SYNOD



NEW LECTIONARY FOR THE ANGLICAN CHURCH IN NORTH AMERICA

The Lectionary is an ordered pattern for Bible Reading throughout the year used by the Church for millennia. On May 1, 2016, we began using this Lectionary for all services. There are two Lectionaries: one for Sunday, and Red Letter Days (Christmas, Epiphany, Ascension etc.). The Sunday Lectionary is arranged in a three year cycle, A, B and C. The Daily Lectionary lists readings for ordinary days. Each Lectionary also contains the history of the Lectionary, and it's intended purpose, and it's adaptation and use in the Anglican tradition. There are copies of the Sunday and Daily Office Lectionary available on the table near the church office. POWER AND JOY IN THE BLESSING PRAYER

Our sovereign Creator God initiated the concept of blessings in Genesis. Speaking of the sea creatures, the winged birds, human male and female and the seventh day of rest He blessed and sanctified all that He had made (Genesis 1:22, 28, 2:3). In a formal agreement of legal validity (a covenant or blessing), God provided for man's success in spite of Adam's sin.

"With each of God's blessings in Scriptures, there was always a special anointing — an impartation of supernatural power that enabled the people He blessed. God's blessings: made impossible things possible; gave above-normal power, means, and ability for competency in living; gave spiritual authority to our humanity."

This power for living belongs to you and me, through the blessing prayer. In all things, we must bring glory to God in all we say and do, and always be positive. Then our blessings are not selfish or worldly in nature. When we claim God's promises in Scripture, our prayers release God's great power and provisions. When we speak what God wills us to speak, our blessing prayers are energized by the power of God, and lives begin to change. Once spoken, our blessings cannot be stopped or thwarted by man or by Satan (Genesis 27).

I bless your eyes to see His truth and the goodness in all people. I bless your tongue to speak in ways to glorify God and edify others, and to understand the power of silence. I bless your mind so you may praise Him in worship and song every day of your life. I bless your body which is a holy temple sanctified for Him. In the name of Jesus Christ I bless you. Amen.

FALL WEDNESDAY EVENING STUDY - WHEN GOD WEEPS

After more than thirty years in a wheelchair, Joni Eareckson Tada's intimate experience with suffering gives her a special understanding of God's intentions for us in our pain. In *When God Weeps*, she and lifelong friend Steven Estes probe beyond glib answers that fail us in our time of deepest need. Instead, with firmness and compassion, they reveal a God big enough to understand our suffering, wise enough to allow it—and powerful enough to use it for a greater good than we can ever imagine. The study is thoroughly Biblical and painfully transparent. THE VESTRY MEETING




