REMEMBER YOUR LEADERS: The Anglican Diocese of Pittsburgh said farewell to Archbishop Bob and Nara Duncan on Saturday, June 18th. Archbishop and Nara have served the Church for four decades, with fifteen+ years as bishop of Pittsburgh, five of those years serving as Archbishop of the Anglican Church in North America. During that time, Archbishop Bob and Nara both experienced significant hospitalization, him while in Africa, and Nara at home.

WHO SPOKE THE WORD OF GOD TO YOU: They endured countless days separated from one another as the Archbishop traveled the world preaching the Gospel, encouraging Biblical Anglicans to unite and remain faithful to the Lord and the Scriptures in North America and around the world.

CONSIDER THE OUTCOME OF THEIR WAY OF LIFE:

From their sacrificial and tireless work the Anglican Church in North America came into being (a seven year process!) and ACNA is recognized by the majority of Anglican Provinces as a Member of the world wide Anglican Communion. Under AB Bob's leadership, <u>Texts for Common Prayer</u> are being developed, an extensive catechism, <u>To Be A Christian</u>, is written, published and being used around the world. The Catechumenate, an extended process of Scriptural Discipleship training for those seeking to be baptized and confirmed in the Church, is being restored. Ecumenical dialogues with biblically faithful Lutherans, Methodists, Presbyterians and the Polish Catholic Church are underway, looking forward to the day when we openly endorse and cooperate in sharing the transforming life of Jesus Christ at home and abroad. IMITATE THEIR FAITH: In 2017 we will celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation. We will celebrate both the Anniversary of and the Continuing Reformation of the Church in our day. Reformation looks neat and tidy in printed documents, but the reformation of the human heart is always messy. Will we, you and I, personally imitate our "leaders faith?" You and I are called to personally sacrificial and costly discipleship. We must stand with and for the return to Biblical faithfulness.

JESUS CHRIST: We must focus on Jesus Christ, His Life, Death, Resurrection, Ascension, Reigning and Promised Return. Only Jesus has the power to transform us by the Holy Spirit. Only Jesus can grace us to stand in the face of a hostile culture. Only Jesus can empower us to repent of our personal sin, and walk in the Spirit living lives that honor Him. As Archbishop Duncan reminded us so often, "Keep the main thing the main thing!" And as our present Archbishop Foley Challenges us: "Forward! Forward! Always Forward!"

PRAY: The pastor of a neighboring church placed a portable sign board outside his parish offices facing the highway. It read: "If you want a better pastor, pray for the one you have." I thanked Fr. Vince for his sign. The greatest gift we can give our leaders is to pray daily for them, their spouses, families, health, protection, and endurance.

Thank you Lord Jesus for the godly leaders you provide for us, who by their sacrificial lives work to build up your Body. Thank you for Bob and Nara, Foley and Allison, and Mark and Cindy, for the clergy of ACNA and the Diocese of the Southwest. Bless their wives and husbands, families and health, provide for their needs and protect them from the assaults of the enemy. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Amen.

CHRISTIAN FORMATION CLASS: TO BE A CHRISTAIN, Anglican Catechism




ACGS Men's Monthly Breakfast






New Bible Study "DISCERNING THE VOICE OF GOD" by Pricilla Shirer.
