The ACGS choir will meet Saturday, August 13th for our end of Summer Choir Day beginning at 1pm at the Holik Farm.



ANGLICAN CHURCH IN NORTH AMERICA: MARRIAGE RITE PUBLISHED

June 23, 2016, *The ACNA Task Force on Marriage, Family, and the Single Li*fe completed the Rite for Holy Matrimony, and the House of Bishops approved of the Rite for use across the Church. From the Introduction to A Commentary:

"It is not every day that a church produces a new liturgy, but this is the situation of the Anglican Church in North America. The development of a new Prayer Book is one of the tasks and privileges granted us in our day. The marriage liturgy is of special importance for the very reason that marriage is under stack in contemporary culture. The Church has a special opportunity therefore to seek the Scripture and tradition and to articulate for its people and for the wider community what it means for a man and woman to be joined in Holy Matrimony." DECELARATION OF INTENTION - What is the Declaration of Intention?

The prospective groom and bride are asked to sign the Church's Doctrinal Statement concerning Holy Matrimony prior to their Marriage being solemnized in The Church. It is appropriate to conduct a signing ceremony of the Declaration of Intention during a public liturgy, to signify that the betrothal has taken place and that both parties have agreed to be prepared by The Church for Holy Matrimony, and to bid the prayers of the congregation.

Declaration of Intention

We, *N.N.*______ and *N.N.*______, desiring the blessing of Holy Matrimony in the Church, do solemnly declare that we hold marriage to be a lifelong union of husband and wife as it is set forth in the Book of Common Prayer. We believe it is established by God for the procreation of children, and their nurture in the knowledge and love of the Lord; for mutual joy, and for the help and comfort given one another in prosperity and adversity; to maintain purity, so that husbands and wives, with all the household of God, might serve as holy and undefiled members of the Body of Christ; and for the upbuilding of Christ's kingdom in family, church, and society, to the praise of his holy Name. We de engage ourselves, so far as in us lies, to make our utmost effort to establish this relationship and to seek God's help thereto.

BANNS OF MARRIAGE - What are they?

The ancient custom of announcing the wedding publically at least three times, also known as the "Banns of Marriage," bids the prayers and support of the community. This speaks to the great necessity for the whole body of Christ to support those joined in Holy Matrimony and their witness in Church and society. CHRISTIAN FORMATION CLASS: TO BE A CHRISTAIN, Anglican Catechism




ACGS Men's Monthly Breakfast


