

FEAST OF THE HOLY CROSS

On Sept. 14, 335, the dedication of a large Basilica was built on the site of the crucifixion of Jesus, used for the Liturgy of the Word, and a circular building called "The Resurrection," was constructed on the site of Jesus' empty tomb, with the Altar built directly over the burial space. Emperor Constantine's mother Helena directed the excavation of the site. There workers



unearthed a cross intact which they believed to be the actual cross on which Jesus died. This site had been visited by Christian pilgrims for several hundred years, and the Romans sought to discourage the activity by making it a garbage dump.

Today, The Basilica of the Resurrection, a church built by Crusaders stands in the same spot, and millions of Christian pilgrims visit and worship at the site of Jesus' crucifixion and Resurrection.

ONE MILE CHALLENGE

A: God Almighty, El Shaddai: "And the sound of the wings of the cherubim was heard as far as the outer court, like the voice of God Almighty (El Shaddai) when he speaks." Ezekiel 10:5

B: the LORD is my Banner, Jehovah Nissi: "And Moses built an altar and called the name of it, The LORD is my banner, saying, 'A hand upon the banner of the LORD!" Exodus 17:15

C: the strong Creator God, Elohim: "In the beginning, God (Elohim) created the heavens and the earth." Genesis 1:1

D: the LORD is my Deliverer, Jehovah Mephalti: "The LORD (Jehovah) is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer (Mephalti)." Psalm 18:2

E: Eternal, Everlasting God, Elohenu Olam: "For this God is our God for ever and ever (Elohenu Olam); he will be our guide even to the end." Psalm 48:14

F: the Faithful God, El Emunah: "Know therefore that the LORD you God is God; he is the faithful God (El Emunah), keeping his covenant of love..." Deuteronomy 7:9

G: God of Glory, El Hakabodh: "The voice of the LORD is over the waters; the God of glory (El Hakabodh) thunders, the LORD thunders over the mighty waters." Psalm 29:3

H: the LORD our Healer, Jehovah Rophe: "...listen carefully to the LORD your God and do what is right in his eyes... for I am the LORD who heals (Jehovah Rophe) you." Exodus 15:26

I: I AM, Yahweh: God said to Moses, "I AM Who I AM (Yahweh)." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel, 'I AM sent me to you." Exodus 3:14

J: the LORD, the Judge, Jehovah Hashopet: "...you are doing me wrong by waging war against me. Let the LORD, the Judge (Jehovah Hashopet) decide the dispute this day..." Judges 11:27

K: God my King, Eli Maelekhi: "They have seen Your procession, O God, the procession of my God, my King (Eli Maelekhi), into the sanctuary." Psalm 68:24

L: the Living God, Elohim Chayim: "This is how you will know that the living God (Elohim Chayim) is among you and that he will certainly drive out (your enemies)..." Joshua 3:10

M: Master over all, Adonia: "O LORD (Adonai) God, You have begun to show Your servant Your greatness and Your strong hand..." Deuteronomy 3:24

Here is my prayer: Holy God of all gods, You alone are worthy of praise and adoration. Thank You for Your mercy and truth, Your wisdom and our Savior. You breathed life into eternity and man. You give me living water and daily bread. You refresh my soul and nourish your spirit within me. There is no greater God than You: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. 

PASTOR'S POW WOW


