Brothers and sisters in Christ,




Game Night December 31st from 5-9pm.

GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Jesus said, "These things I have spoken to you while being present with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your rememberance all things that I said to you." John 14:25-26 And, "Nevertheless I tell you the truth. It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I don not go away, the Helper will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you. And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin and of righteousness and of judgment." John 16:7-8

Jesus' death and resurrection mean may things to Christians: redemption, salvation, freedom, and eternal life. The also opened the doorway for the Holy Spirit to become alive in us. He is called the Paraclete, Comforter, Counselor, Helper, Advocate, Intercessor, Teacher, Standby, Strengthener, and more. He is the active Mediator between our Father God and us, convicting us of sin, righteousness and judgment. He is the third Person of God, the Diety of God, everywhere at once and eternal, equal to the Father and Son. His gifts are free tor the taking. Spritual gifts are grace gifts; that is to say, God given beyond what we deserve. The are revealed in the Old and the New Testament, given to equip us for God's service. We do ourselves a disservice by not engaging in these gifts. We are being left out of God's design and joy for us when we deny or ignore our gifts, for they allow us to make transformation of God's world.

Are you aware of your Spiritual fits? Do you use them in your personal and private worship of our God? Do you know how to use them, voluntarily, to enhance the body of Christ? Do you encourage others in faith to use their gifts? Are you ready for an adventure individually and corporately in obedient service to Christ? Then fasten you seatbelt, True Believer, and here we go!

- 1) Identify Gifts: There are many on-line free surveys. The Wagner-Modified Houts Questionnaire, is comprehensive, covering 25 spiritual gifts with related scriptural references, and will give you a "tentative evaluation of where your gifts may lie. As with all things these should be confirmed by others that know you as well as by those who are you pastor and elders in the Lord." (p. 15) Remember that spiritual gifts are different from talents and the fruit of the Spirit.
- 2) Awareness: Become aware and won your gifts through prayer, discernment, meditation, study, and discussion with others, in faith. Identify your passion(s) to serve God.
- 3) Apply: Use your gifts; encourage others to do the same. Edify one another in the body of Christ.
- 4) Further study: C. Peter Wagner's book, Your Spiritual Gifts Can Help Your Church Grow.

THIS CHANGED EVERYTHING: FIVE HUNDRED YEARS OF THE REFORMATION

In October 2017, we will commemorate the 500th Anniversary of Martin Luther's posting of "The 95 Theses" on the door of the Wittenberg University chapel. This is considered the date the "The Protestant Reformation" began. During the Christian Formation Hour on Sunday, January 22, we will begin a fourteen-week exploration of the Reformation, its roots, its teachings, its hopes, failures and consequences. We will also consider what lessons we might learn and apply to the current life and ministry of the Church today. Classes will feature a DVD presentation prepared by the Christian History Institute, and includes contributors from Roman Catholic, Anglican, Protestant and Anabaptist traditions. To participate please register in the Narthex beginning on January 15 so that adequate study materials may be prepared.

Why should I care about the Reformation? (From the Program Guide)

The Reformation is more than a fascinating period of history -- it significantly impacted the formation of Western Civilization. The questions reformers raised remain critical for the church today. Like the reformers, we must still discern what or who is our ultimate authority. We continue to seek understanding about what it means to be saved by grace through faith, even when we know that faith without works is dead. We persist in debating the meaning of baptism and communion, the role of the Scripture and of the clergy, and the definition of the true church. We continue to struggle with the separation of church and state. This series is not only a journey into our past but also an essential exercise for discerning how we are to live as Christians in a divided church.


