CHURCH GROWTH

In the recent Parish Profile Survey that many of you completed, this statement was given, "I believe that it is important for Good Shepherd to grow." Ninety-one percent of the respondents either agreed or agreed strongly with the need for growth. None disagreed or disagreed strongly. That is as close to unanimous as a church group is going to get. That statement when combined with the average age of the respondents of 68 years old means that growth is not just "important". Growth is "crucial".

The obvious question is, "How do we bring growth to our parish?" Being lifelong Episcopalians and more recently Anglicans our immediate and natural response is, "We just need to call a really nice and competent priest, and he or she will fill this place up!". The data shows that most newcomers come to a church because they were invited by a friend or family member. Obviously welcoming and capable clergy are absolutely essential, but the first encouragement to get the newcomer through the door for the first time comes from regular laypersons like you and me.

Although we are going through a time of transition at Good Shepherd, we have a wonderfully gifted clergy. We have great music. We have meaningful Sunday School, Bible study, and Worship. When was the last time that you encouraged an unchurched friend or family member to come to Good Shepherd? I encourage you to start inviting them this week. It is "crucial" for them and for us. "WE ARE POSSESSED"

Lent allows us 40 days before Easter to meditate upon the cross. Rightfully so, Christians cannot even look at the cross without running the gamut of emotions: shock, horror, terror, revulsion, grief, pathos; then wonder, relief, hope, and joy. Jesus Christ lived and died according to the will of His Father, to save us from eternal despair, to bring us home again, united and reconciled with God. Jesus did this for you and for me, once and for all, the ultimate act of love and salvation.

How can we understand this kind of love from the Supreme Creator of the universe, King of kings and Lord of lords, that He sent His only Son to live, die, and rise victoriously from the grave for all humanity? He tells us in His own Word we are created in His image. We are the apple of His eye. We are His delight and He will never leave or forsake us. God named us in the beginning, and knitted us within our mothers' wombs. Jesus' death and resurrection tore the veil and broke the barrier separating us from the Father, shattering the wall of sin that came with Adam's fall from grace. We seek the mind of Christ and follow in His holy footsteps as the body of Christ, the Church. We desire to be His hands and feet, continuing His worldly ministry as His disciples.

Our God continually calls us to be holy and separate for Himself, speaks and listens to us, lives in us, gives us good works to walk in for His honor and glory in this world, corrects and rebukes us when we stray.
