Name: Stephen L. Shaw (Steve)

How did you come to follow Jesus? My parents raised me in the Mertzon Baptist Church, and I committed my life to Jesus at about age 10, and was baptized there.

Who or what attracted you to Good Shepherd? Fr. Stan ministered to my aged Mother in the last years of her life, and this Parish was very welcoming when we visited. **When did you become a Confirmed member of Good Shepherd?** In 2012 we transferred from our then home Parish, Christ Church Anglican-Midland.

How often do you participate in corporate worship? Three or four Sundays a month. I work in Midland Tuesday through Friday which limits my ability to attend during the week.

What is your pattern of regular Bible reading and study? I try to read all the readings of the Daily Office in the Prayer Book each day.

Do you participate in a small group Bible Study, Prayer Group or fellowship group? Not currently, due to work schedule.

What ongoing Christian Formation programs offered in the Parish do you participate? I sometimes attend Sunday School, but not regularly.

The standard of giving in the Anglican Church in North America is the tithe. Do you tithe, or are you increasing your financial giving to reach that level of commitment? I am working to increase my financial giving.

In what ways are you "Reaching Individuals and Families of the Concho Valley with the Transforming Love of Jesus Christ"? I give financial support to West Texas Boys Ranch. I provide a subtle Christian witness when I give professional talks to civic clubs or at ASU. I support outreach activities of Good Shepherd as much as possible.

How can our Church be more effective in "Reaching Individuals and Families of the Concho Valley with the Transforming Love of Jesus Christ"? We all need to remember "At all times preach the Gospel – if necessary use words..." We can all model our Christian faith – in traffic as we drive, in the grocery store, at work – everywhere we go. God will give us opportunities and the words to speak to others, if we give Him a willing heart. Remember, most people come to visit a Church for the first time because someone invited them.

How do you share your faith in Jesus? I work on not being shy about talking about Jesus and our faith with people I meet. If I mentally stay ready to talk with others, and remember to listen instead of talking about myself, God gives opportunities.

What particular gifts or abilities do you bring to this leadership position? I have served on the Vestry of St. Nicholas Episcopal Church in Midland twice, including terms as both Junior Warden and Senior Warden. Then I was part of the small core that formed Christ Church Anglican-Midland and was logistics coordinator (chairs, altar set-up, stage assembly, storage, work team organizer, etc) when our Parish family began meeting at a Christian school. Then I served as co-Chair of the Building Committee when we designed and built our new facility in north Midland.

Where do you see Good Shepherd Church in five years? I see us still in our church building. I believe active Christian witness in which members of this Parish family are involved and that our Parish has facilitated provide visibility and a sense of authentic caring and momentum. This genuine, loving effort will attract others so that we will grow in numbers, maybe double.

What is/are the next step(s) to reaching that goal? We need to energize our own, individual witness to people we meet. We need to wear name tags – not for each other or because they go with our clothes – but because they allow us to breakdown the first barrier for visitors to our worship or sponsored activities. We need to all be active greeters on Sunday. Statistics (Purpose Driven Church) are that even in the South, 80% of the people, while claiming to be Christian, are unchurched. Christianity is under siege in the United States today. Our goal must be to reach the unchurched...not to fight with or try to influence other denominations. We need to figure out how to have a presence at Angelo State and on-line to attract young people to worship with us. Outreach to young families is also needed to help young parents, home schooling parents, and parents with teenage kids. Good Shepherd needs to do occasional media advertising and to cultivate a free lance writer or member of the Press to visit and see us, so nice stories show up in the Standard Times on several Saturdays each year.
