# News from Judith and Alekcey Murillo in Costa Rica

I don't know about you, but my (Judith) experience has been that God's intricate design for my life rarely follows the simplistic linear projections of my carefully laid-out 5-year strategic plans. So why should I expect anything else for those He has called me to disciple? This month, I'd like to share the example of Adilia, a young Cabécar woman who I've had the privilege of mentoring over the last 4-5 years.

I first met Adilia when she was a high school student. She became involved in the Art Mentorship Program I was directing at the time. It was clear right away that she was a highly intelligent and determined individual. At the time, she was living away from her family to attend high school outside of the reservation. Besides being one of the few indigenous students, she was further ostracized by many of the other students, and even teachers, for her dedication as a follower of Christ.

In her last year of high school, she became a part of the first class of our maternal-infant health promotor's training program (Puentes de Vida). In addition to finishing high school, quite a feat for someone whose parents never attended a day of school, she graduated at the top of her class in Puentes de Vida. Last August, she began working along with another health promotor to bring life and light to the women and children of a very dark and oppressive area of the reservation. After a few months of working, her partner quit under the overwhelming challenges of working in this area. Adilia was also beaten down, but wanted to continue to work with the program in some capacity.

It was during this time that she took some time off to live with Cynthia Villavicencio, a Costa Rican missionary physician who has been helping me with the Puentes de Vida, and whom Adilia met through this program. Cynthia and her husband, a North American missionary, are directors for a variety of projects their mission has for the people in their community (about 30 minutes from where we have our base of operations). One is a tutoring program for Cabecar elementary and high school students who have left the reservation for greater educational opportunities (the public schools outside of the reservation are of significantly higher quality). As can be expected, these students experience tremendous challenges including language, culture, academics, and bullying from their peers (and even teachers).

Within a couple of weeks of Adilia's arrival to Cynthia's house, the volunteer tutor quit the program (within a month of the students' finishing school). Always adamant that she never wanted to be a teacher, Adilia reluctantly stepped in - and loved it. Unlike the previous tutor, she was a Cabécar Indian herself. Not only that, she had been in their shoes in going to a "Sikwa" (non -indigenous) school. The students blossomed under Adilia's tutelage. Everyone passed their classes last year (school year ends in December here). One girl who had stopped speaking her na-tive language (she had told Cynthia that she had "forgotten" how to speak it) due to the shame of being a Cabécar, began speaking her language again.

The school year starts in February, and Adilia is passionate about working with the tutoring program again this year. She has struggled with what her continued role with Puentes de Vida may be, and I know that part of this is because she hasn't wanted to disappoint her mentors. She will likely continue to be involved mainly in helping to produce quality patient education materials in the Cabécar language for the program along with Cynthia. It has been my privilege to share with her my own labyrinthine journey that God has taken me on, and release her to Him.

#### Shrove Tuesday Pancake and Sausage Supper

"Fat Tuesday" - March 4<sup>th</sup> being the last day of the season of Epiphany, we will hold our annual Shrove Tuesday Supper hosted by the Vestry in the Parish House from 6:00-7:00 PM. Shrove Tuesday is traditionally the day that all meat and fat products are removed from the pantry in anticipation of the Lenten fast which begins the following day, Ash Wednesday. #### Ash Wednesday

March 5<sup>th</sup> begins the 40 days of Lent, not counting Sundays, in preparation for the Celebration of our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection. The Season of Lent is a period of reflection on the love of God demonstrated on the Cross, and our response or lack of response in daily following our Lord Jesus. Its marked by periods of prayer, fasting and alms giving. Ashes are the Biblical symbol for repentance, and are placed on the forehead or the hands as a reminder of our mortality and repentance and need of our Savior Jesus Christ. The liturgical color for the hangings and vestments is purple, there are no flowers gracing the sanctuary, the music more reflective, with Alleluias disappearing until the Great Vigil of Easter on Holy Saturday. The Holy Eucharist will be celebrated on Ash Wednesday at 6:30 PM in the church, with the distribution of ashes following the service.

The lighted evergreens on either side of the Altar in the sanctuary festively remind us that God is manifesting Himself to the world in Jesus, The Light of the World!

On Ash Wednesday, we will be using our new Violet Lenten Altar Hangings and Vestments. These were purchased through Memorial Funds donated to the Altar Guild over the last several years.
