Brothers and sisters in Christ,

On West Beauregard Avenue near the Village Shopping Plaza is a tree which stands 50 feet high if an inch. It's beautiful. What makes it exceptional is that growing up the truck and spreading throughout the branches is a Trumpet Vine, and during the summer months, the vine is covered with exquisite orange flowers. The tree and its vine are a multi-storied humming bird feeder and a delight to the eves of passersby. Deacon June and Rick raise vines on their farm in Ballinger. Theirs are a grape vines. The difference between them is fundamental. The tree and vine in town do not share the same source of life. The grape vine and its braches do. Both require care, but the grape vine requires more intensive care than the tree-vine combination. Planning and packing for a trip to El Paso should be old hat for me by now. I have been traversing back and forth between San Angelo/Mertzon and El Paso for over forty years. Having property and family in both areas made hundreds of trips necessary. Invariably, I leave the task of loading the travel vehicle until the last day. Preparing for the journey to see the consecration of Bishop Mark Zimmerman on February 28, 2014 was no exception in respect to my habit of procrastination. My packing list included clothes, sundry items, road food, and household items for a family in Mexico. I scanned the inside of my Yukon which I drive regularly, checking all essentials for a safe and comfortable trip. My eves spotted the last bag I had to give the next homeless person I found in San Angelo. That bag had been there many months, so many I had rechecked expiration dates several times on food items. Everything was fresh. Then I heard the Lord say, "Take the bag with you," What? Add one more thing into the diesel truck, my travel vehicle for this trip? His message was clear. Surely He had a plan for this bag. There was plenty of room for one more thing. So I placed the bag inside a box of a similar size, on the floor board of the front passenger seat. There, I told myself, I can reach it when I need to give it away.

Travel was routine, just what I anticipated between my home and I-10. I know exactly where and when to take rest stops, how to anticipate traffic, and was yet again in El Paso in record time. My sister, Gennell, and I spent the next few days in our usual frenzy of shopping, visiting, and eating every taco in sight. We attended the joyful celebration for Bishop Mark with friends from El Paso and San Angelo. The give away bag still sat on the floor of my truck.

Saturday, March 1, my friend Mary and I planned to visit another friend, Joe, who has Parkinson's disease. The first order of business was to refuel for my return trip home. The best price on diesel fuel is at the Walmart with easy access off I-10 on the east side of town. Even with my best intentions, I was already running late. The stress of maneuvering this larger truck into the prescribed pump area was all consuming. My prepaid card took care of the \$80.00 purchase. I was nearly finished pumping fuel when I looked up. There he was in front of me on the rock filled median: a disheveled, bearded man in dirty baggy pants and oversized coat. He limped, walking gingerly with a cane carrying a tennis shoe in one hand, one foot in a shoe and the other clearly swollen in a flip flop. I hastened to fill my tank. When I looked up again he was gone. Vanished. Taking care of business, I stood in line for my receipt, then drove around the station looking for him. Nothing. I got out to look behind a barrier housing a trash dumpster, but he was nowhere to be seen. I drove slowly around the block, anxious with anticipation. And there he was, exactly where I had first seen him. I drove up to him as he walked away. "Mister, do you speak English?" I said as I rolled down my window.

"Yes," he answered.

"Here, I have something for you," I said hastily, shoving the bag his way. Then, realizing the difficulty he had balancing his weight with the bag and his swollen foot, I jumped out of the truck, leaving it running beside me. "It has food, and water, and a bible, and money," I told him. "Jesus loves you, and I do to." "God bless you, lady," he said. God bless me, he said. Indeed, God did bless me.

What a small item: a white cloth bag with the Anglican Church of the Good Shepherd logo on the side, filled with crackers, Vienna sausages, applesauce, bottles of water, plastic utensils, napkins, Kleenex, GermX, Chapstick, bandaids, antibacterial salve, a bible, \$10 cash, candies. It became so much more when the Lord directed my path to do His Will, person to person, in an El Paso gas station parking lot. What joy happens when we listen as God speaks. Finally arriving at Mary's house, I said, "Sorry I'm late my friend." Mary laughed. "Jean, everyone knows you are always late!"
