Sophomores were observed to hold their second year student status over their freshmen counterparts. Thus, they were given the name sophomores, which means 'wise fools'. Boasting is something we dismiss unless we are boasting about ourselves. It seems to relegate the 'boaster' to the ranks of 'wise fools' or sophomores. But Scripture gives a reason for boasting. The prophet Jeremiah (9.23-24) gives this word from the LORD: "Let not the wise man boast of his wisdom, or the strong man boast of his strength or the rich man boast of his riches, but let him who boasts boast about this: that he understands and knows Me, that I am the LORD, who exercises kindness, justice and righteousness on earth, for in these I delight."

What is it that the LORD is commending to you and me? The Hebrew word 'boast' used here means to be clear (in speech); to shine; hence to make a show, to boast, and thus to be (clamorously) foolish; to rave, and to *celebrate*. The Apostle Paul reminds us that the world thinks the "message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing..."(1 Co.1.18). It still seems foolish to the perishing to boast that we know the Lord! Uncertainty and ambiguity are the currency of the day. But one can only speak with certainty and unambiguously about something, or someone they actually know. Now, as always, Christians need to be clear, shine, make a show of, rave and celebrate our knowledge of the one and only true God! Jesus came to reveal the true nature of God to us so that we might have eternal life. He tells us in John 17.1-3: "Now this is eternal life: that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom You sent." Apostle Peter urges us to: "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." (1 Pt. 3.18)

Near the entrance to the parish hall these is a large Plexiglas sign which was donated by a member of our parish who is now with the Lord. It reads. "To Know Christ, and to Make Him known." That is the heritage of Good Shepherd Church. That is why we exist. That is our charism, our gift in the Holy Spirit. Mark Brown shared in his testimony that he believed a sign should be placed on the parking area reading: "Beware! God is on the Premises!" God indeed is among us. He is here, and we strive, study and seek to know Him more and more. So, let's be clear! Let's make a show of it, let's boast, rave and celebrate it! The perishing may think us 'foolish' but those who the Lord is calling will come to believe and be saved.
