AGNUS DEI

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Thousands of illegal aliens teeming across the Texas/US border, Russian aggression against The Ukraine, the ongoing war being waged by Hamas against Israel, the expulsion of Christians by radical Islamists in Irag, the ongoing assaults, murder and kidnapping of Christians in Moslem countries and the destruction of churches and personal property, not to mention the continuing law suit by the Episcopal Church in suing us for the church property ... we haven't mentioned the various serious situations that many of us or our families personally face daily. How are we to respond? What are we to do? **First and foremost**, we are to rejoice in the presence of our Heavenly Father, who through His only begotten Son Jesus Christ has extended His grace, mercy and peace to us. Worship and praise Him with thanksgiving and gratitude. "We know that in all things God is working for good for those who love Him and are the called according to His purpose." (Rom. 8.28) Second, pray. Pray for our enemies. Pray that illegal aliens, Russians, Ukrainians, Moslems and Jews, and the leadership of the Episcopal organization come to know the "grace, mercy and peace" that we have come to know in ourselves. Fourth, encourage our government leaders. Telephone, email or write to the president and representatives who will be in their districts during the August recess to act responsibly in carrying out their duties to provide for the security of our nation, and to speak up and act on behalf of those who are suffering around the world, including those suffering because of their faith. Perhaps, just perhaps, the Lord has chosen us for just such a time as this. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit! Amen.

September Agnus Dei **Deadline is August 18**

The following capital improvements are needed at the church campus, and are listed in the order of priority.

Reroofing the flat section of the roof over the Narthex, vestibule, chapel, rest rooms, church offices, and library. Project: to replace the current roof application with state of the art vinyl roofing, including replacing water damaged structural wood as needed.

Repair roof over the North side of the Christian Education wing damaged by storm. Our property insurance adjustor and carrier has already sent funds to complete this work.

Repairing/resurfacing the rear parking lot at the Parish House entrance. Damaged and loose pieces of paving material present a safety hazard.

Tree trimming. Remove recent storm damaged limbs which are hanging from the trees on the perimeter of the West Beauregard (front) parking lot. These are known as "widow makers" as they may suddenly fall upon the unsuspecting passerby.

Repair and Update Signage. The stone and wooden signage at the corner of West Beauregard and Moritz circle was damaged by a "hit and run." Our insurance carrier has already sent funds for the repair of the signage. We are considering new signage with electrical lighting.

Replacing the tile floors in the rest rooms of the Parish Hall corridor. Estimates are being solicited for finishing the floors with polished concrete or with ceramic tile and baseboard.

Repairing and making functional the lawn sprinkling system.*

Painting the restrooms on the Parish Hall corridor. This would be completed prior to the refurbishing of the floor, and would also require removing and returning the stall privacy barriers before and after.*

Painting and redecorating the restrooms off the Narthex.*

Repairing or replacing the tile floor in the Parish Hall. This floor was damaged in the last storm which produced heavy rains. The water level rose in the Garth and ran under the sliding doors into the Parish Hall.

The Vestry's hope is that as much as can be done will be done by volunteers from the congregation. Cost estimates will be made available as bids are submitted to Corey Peddy, Junior Warden.

Expertise: some members of the congregation have expertise in some of the above areas. If you do would you be willing to serve with Corey Peddy, the Junior Warden, to plan, organize, evaluate contractor's proposals and bids, and oversee the completion of contracted work?
