

### **All Saints Day**

#### **November 2**

This Festival originated in the ancient Church as the observance of All Martyrs before the year 270 AD. In 370 AD, Ephrem the Deacon mentions the celebration in Edessa on May 13, and the Patriarch John Chrysostom, who died in 407 AD, says that the Festival of All Saints was observed on the first Sunday after Pentecost in Constantinople. The Eastern Church celebrates All Saints on the same day the Western Church celebrates Pentecost.

It is believed by many that the commemoration of All Saints on November 1 originated in Ireland, spread to England, and then to the continent of Europe. That it had reached Rome and had been adopted there early in the ninth century is attested buy a letter of Pope Gregory the Fourth, who served from 828-844, to the Emperor Louis "the Pious," urging that such a festival be observed throughout the Holy Roman Empire.
