Giving gifts is not a peculiarly Christian or Biblical activity. Gifts given to honor a birth or birthdays are common across many cultures. Gifts given at Christmas take on a special meaning.

Let's consider what is common to all gift giving and what is special about Christmas gifts.

Gifts are given as tokens of love, esteem and favor. We express our love for others by giving them that which we consider precious and meaningful. Engagement rings are one of these gifts. We honor others by presenting them with a token of our esteem for their character or devotion to duty, such as when a soldier is awarded a medal of honor for saving comrades lives. We also offer gifts in order to gain the favor of the recipient. Quite often government officials will present gifts to leaders of other nations to win their approval and cooperation. If the truth be told, elements of all three may be present when we engage in gift giving.

Christmas, and Christian giving has a special significance. From the earliest celebrations of the birth of Jesus Christians gave gifts of food, clothing, shelter, care and cover to those who could give nothing in return. For Christians giving is a reflection of God's love for us, undeserved, unmerited and unsought. Christians give gifts in the recognition that "God so loved the people of the world that He gave His one and only Son that anyone who puts their faith in Jesus would not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3.16) The gifts given by the magi, or wise men, to the infant Jesus, draw our attention to this unique aspect of gift giving common to Christians.

The "gold, frankincense and myrrh" were costly and precious. Gold for a King; Frankincense for a God; and Myrrh for a Sacrifice. These gifts acknowledge the GIFT given, "for unto us a child is born, and unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Is. 9.6) As the magi gave the costliest gifts they could offer, let us also bring the costliest gift we can bring: bring ourselves to the Lord Jesus, acknowledge Him as our King, worship Him as our God, and Honor Him as the Sacrifice who took away the sin of the world. As we give ourselves to the Lord, let us share Him with those around us who need to know His love this Christmas too! Blessed Advent and Christmastide!

Another bridge project is ready to start after the rainy season is over. Because of the bridges Alekcey has been able to initiate, even more lives are being saved. Generous people and nations have contributed to the success of the bridges being built. When every bridge is finished, Alekcey and Judith organize a dedication service giving thanks to The Lord for the bridge and the safety of the workers during the completion.


