Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are creatures of habit. When I drive to the church campus from home, I take College Hills Boulevard to Oxford to West Beauregard and into the church parking area. When I return home, I usually take the same route. I rarely notice anything different in the neighborhood of the church. Since learning of the "One Mile Challenge", I am not only taking different routes to get to and from the church, I'm paying closer attention to who is on the streets, what kind of vehicles are in front of homes, are there children around, are the homes in good shape or in need of repair. I'm praving for our neighbors in a concerted way, asking the Lord how you and I can reach out to them.

We are accepting Archbishop Foley's charge to participate in the "One Mile Challenge." Archbishop called on all congregations to visit those living within a one mile radius of their church campuses; to meet them, get to know them, pray for them, and invite them to worship.

We are recruiting folks to pray for our neighbors and Visiting Teams by name, serve as a member of two person teams, and provide transportation to and from the streets we will visit, then back to our church parking area. We plan to visit all the homes bordered by College Hills Boulevard, West Beauregard Avenue to Moritz Circle to Sherwood Way to the Red Arroyo, and back to College Hills Boulevard. There will be a map of the streets we are visiting, and the progress we make.

Our plan is to prepare by praying and practicing our remarks as we meet folks. We will be coached by Corey Peddy and Teddye Read, experienced door to door visitors. We will have a church brochure to give those with whom we speak, ask them how they believe the church can make a positive impact in our neighborhood, and ask if we can pray for them or a concern they have. Before leaving we will invite them to worship with us. We expect to be at each home from 5-7 minutes. We will not go inside the homes, nor solicit or accept donations.

Let's pray for one another as the Lord prepares us in Reaching our neighbors with the Transforming Love of Jesus Christ!

Clergy of the ADSW January 28, 2015

Dear friends,

Cindy and I just got back from California where we were able to celebrate the consecration of the Rt. Rev. Keith Andrews as the next ACNA bishop of the Western States. The service was glorious and brought my heart right back to St. Clement's eleven months ago. It was good to be there to support Keith. His diocese is even bigger than this one and borders on ours in Arizona. As I look back on the better part of my first year I have become incredibly aware of my need for prayer support. I believe I would still be very sick if it was not for all of your prayers. One of our fellow bishops has set up a team of thirty-one prayer intercessors that commit to pray for him one day each month. This is a great idea, and so I am asking you to consider making that commitment to me. I would like to collect thirty-one names of people throughout the diocese who would be willing to pray for me one day each month. I will assign everyone on the list a day and keep in touch with my intercessors with special prayer concerns and my calendar so they know how to pray for me. It would be very helpful if each church could collect names of volunteers and send that list back to me by e-mail. I will need people's e-mail addresses in order to set up a contact group. I thank you in advance for considering to help me in this crucial manner.

I have also recently returned from the College of Bishops meeting in Orlando. *(Yes, Orlando and California are lovely in the winter, but I need a few days at home. There really is no place like home)* A good summary of our work in Orlando is posted on the ACNA website. However, I have a few reflections I would like to share with you.

The first is that we are indeed blessed by some great teachers and preachers in the College. Everything we did was framed by Biblical worship, preaching, and teaching. Gone are the days when we strictly focused on business. We kept our focus on the Word of God. As a result, we came back empowered by the Spirit, not drained by politics, and arguments about the placement of commas in canons.

Secondly, I was blessed by the Spirit of unity and brotherhood that is growing more and more as the College gathers together. While the alphabet soup of overlapping oversight seems to cause a good deal of tension, the bishops have come to trust each other and believe in time the Holy Spirit will bring order.

One of the topics that we discussed was how we as a church should approach marriage. At a time in which the culture is moving away from a Biblical understanding of marriage in many ways, we believe that we need to address these issues with care, prayer, and be able to speak the truth in love. A task force has been appointed is working on a statement that honors God's Word and is something we as a College can all support. We are being careful not to lose our ability to engage the culture on this crucial topic.

It was noted that within the next seven years many of our current bishops will be retiring. The College will look very different in a short amount of time. We want to be intentional about making these transitions in the best way possible. One of the ways we intend to do that is to set up a mentoring program for the new bishops. We will host the first of these programs here in Albuquerque. Bishop Bill Murdoch will work with me and Bishop Keith Andrews in April. Other bishops have also been invited. The teaching at the College revolved around recovering an Apostolic understanding of the role of Bishop as teacher, servant, and intermediary between bride *(the church)* and bridegroom *(Christ).* It was noted that Bishops must maintain a healthy humility and operate with the authority of love not the coercion of power, *"for the floors of hell are paved with the skulls of bishops."*-St. Athanasius

We also spent a good deal of time talking about the importance of prayer in the life of a bishop. This brings me full circle. Once again I ask that you would consider serving on my team of intercessors. If the Spirit is leading you to help me in this way please let your rector know so that he can give me your name and e-mail address.
