When are you being stretched and growing as a Christ follower? Looking back I see times of recognizable growth when I was with other believers in small groups. For four years I participated in a Friday morning men's fellowship. Twenty to twenty five men met from 7-8 AM, every Friday morning for coffee, doughnuts and a half hour Bible lesson. The men came from different churches, many varied occupations, and a wide range of age groups (20's -80's). The FMMF still meets faithfully. But as good as the FMMF was the most important time came each week as four of us cleaned up after the big meeting, talking and praying for one another in the kitchen from 8-9 AM.

Eileen and I also hosted a Bible study in our family room for a number of years. We drank coffee, ate doughnuts, sang and worshipped, studied the Bible, prayed for one another, encouraged and held one another accountable, saw people surrender themselves to Jesus, baptized people in our backyard swimming pool, participated in some weddings and funerals together. We became close friends. Most important of all, we learned the Holy Spirit gives each of us gifts to use in serving one another, and we were stretched and grew as we began to pray aloud for one another, share our struggles and victories, share what the Lord was doing in our lives, explain the Gospel to new folks, and pray with them as they asked Jesus to take over their lives.

Over the last year I see the same growth at Good Shepherd. Small group meetings, retreats, quiet days, gatherings over a meal, home groups, all have been places where I hear folks sharing how they are being stretched in their faith and growing as they come to know and share the Lord Jesus more personally. Now that the summer is waning, I encourage you to participate in a small Christ centered small group. If you need some help in finding one, or will consider opening your home for a small group meeting, I'd be glad to help you.

September 14-HOLY CROSS DAY

The historian Eusebius, in his *Life of Constantine*, tells how that emperor ordered the erection of a complex of buildings in Jerusalem "on a scale of imperial magnificence," to set forth as "an object of attraction and veneration to all, the blessed place of our Savior's Resurrection." The over-all supervision of the work - on the site where the Church of the Holy Sepulcher now stands - was entrusted to Constantine's mother, St Helena. Jerusalem had been destroyed in 70 AD, and the Roman City *Aelia Capitolina* was built over the ruins, with the hill of Calvary, which was outside the original walls, buried in tons of fill. During the excavations directed by Helena a relic, believed to be



the cross on which Jesus was crucified, was discovered. The circular basilica's Altar was placed on the site of the empty tomb, and the church dedicated as the Church of the Resurrection. The buildings were completed on September 14, 335.

We would love to have your join us on a regular basis, or just stop in when you are able. We will pray for you and your needs, and you can pray for us.


The answer to above questions is yes, yes, and yes!



Wednesday Night Study - IMMERESED IN THE BOOK OF REVELATION

Wednesday September 30 begins a yearlong series of studies in the <u>Book of Revelation</u>. We will kick off our study on <u>September 30</u>, the DVD "Revelation Illustrated" will be shown. It is an artist's depiction of the scenes from The Revelation with the Scriptural text set to classical music. <u>October 7</u> we begin a 20-week study featuring a DVD presentation: "The Gospel in the Book of Revelation" by the Rev. Dr. Rod Whitacre of Trinity School for Ministry. The second half of the hour will be a discussion of the class. Outlines will be provided for all classes. This study is the classical understanding the Church has had since the time of the Apostles. <u>March 30</u> we begin a different take on The Revelation by the Rev. Dr. John Stott. This study highlights the Revelation of the Person of Jesus in the Book. All participants will use their own Bible and outlines or study guided for each person will be provided. This promises to be tremendously encouraging for all and it is strongly suggested that each person commit to participating in the entire series.
