"Can we pray for you?" Mark and I were surprised at the door of the first home we visited on our **One Mile Challenge**. We introduced ourselves, told the residents where we were from, and asked if we could pray for them. They greeted us enthusiastically, saying that they had no prayer needs, but that they wanted to pray for us as we visited in the neighborhood. The second door we knocked on was answered by a young woman. We made our introductions, and asked if we could pray for her. Initially she said "no." Her little son came to the door, and we offered them a DVD on the Life of Jesus in English and Spanish. She accepted, and then said, "Well, there is something you can pray for." She began to cry and told us that her husband had lost his oil field job, they were living on savings, and the situation at home was 'tense.' We prayed for them.

One team was greeted by a man who said: "I don't believe in God." The team members simply talked with him, listening to his questions. His comment was that he had not encountered Christians who were willing to listen. They encouraged him to talk with "our pastor." His son came to the door, and the team offered a Life of Jesus DVD in Spanish and English. The dad said the son could receive it. The team tried to end the conversation three times, and the gentleman called them back. They ended up praying with him and for his family. Another team found a neighbor distraught over the condition of her sister who had numerous complications from surgery and after care, and was now in a nursing home. She asked us to pray for her, her sister and their family who had been traumatized by the weeks of waiting and watching. One of the team members got into the van on their first day and said, "Well, I'm not talking! I'll pray!" By the time the team reached the third home, she was talking and praying with folks the team visited. One neighbor came to worship with us several weeks for additional prayer at the service for her sister who was severely ill.

We accepted the Archbishop's One Mile Challenge last Spring with all the trepidation of anyone who has never made door to door cold calls. What we discovered, was that 98% of the people were very receptive to our visit, quite open about prayer needs and encouraged that someone had come to share the transforming love of Jesus with them. We asked for and expected nothing. What we received was the blessing of ministering to men and women. The Lord made the appointments, and we showed up. Pray about joining at team for **One Mile Challenge** as we begin visiting again in October.

Chrismon Tree Planned for the Parish Hall

Since early Christianity, the term *chrismon* has traditionally referred to any symbol or figure reminiscent of the name of Christ, In the 20th century the term also started to be used in a wider sense to refer to ornaments that are "symbols for Christ or some part of Christ's ministry"; these are often used during Advent and Christmas, to decorate a Chrismon tree (or a Christmas tree), and include "the dove, descending down, fish, Celtic cross, Jerusalem cross, shepherd's crook, chalice, shell, and others". The chrismon ornaments are decorated in the traditional Gold and White.



We will be making Chrismon ornaments for our large tree in the Parish Hall. The first crafting session will be October 3, at 1pm in the Parish Hall. Due to the size of the tree, we will need many ornaments for decorating. Please bring any scraps of gold and white trim, braid, beads, fabric, sequins, fringe etc. you might have on hand (all gold and white). We will also be purchasing supplies to for decorating too. The ornaments will be made from styrofoam, foam board, and wood. We will have the forms ready to decorate. If you can't attend the crafting session but would still like to make some ornaments to hang on the tree, we will have kits available to be picked up. Just let us know how many you might want to decorate.

If you want to donate any gold, white, or clear ornaments, we will be needing those to fill in around the chrismons. We plan to decorate the Parish Hall Christmas tree on November 29th after the 10:30 service. We are also needing to borrow floor lamps . The overhead lighting in the parish hall is rather harsh so we intend to place floor lamps around the perimeter of the room to make the room prettier.

Wednesday Night Study IMMERSED INTHE BOOK OF REVELATION

We kicked off our study on September 30, with the DVD "Revelation Illustrated". An artist's depiction of the scenes from The Revelation with the Scriptural text set to classical music. <u>October 7</u> we begin a 20-week study featuring a DVD presentation: "The Gospel in the Book of

Revelation" by the Rev. Dr. Rod Whitacre of Trinity School for Ministry. The second half of the hour will be a discussion of the class. Outlines will be provided for all classes. This study is the classical understanding the Church has had since the time of the Apostles. <u>March 30</u> we begin a different take on The Revelation by the Rev. Dr. John Stott. This study highlights the Revelation of the Person of Jesus in the Book. All participants will use their own Bible and outlines or study guides for each person will be provided. This promises to be tremendously encouraging for all and it is strongly suggested that each person commit to participating in the entire series.

On October 7, at 10:00 AM in the library we will begin a 5 week Bible Study Course based on the movie, **War Room**. There are Bible Study books (only 3 days a week homework!) The class will consist of a very short video clip of the movie and Bible references for each session.

Generally, we are at a home for no more than 10 minutes. We do not visit alone or go inside the house. We do not ask for or receive donations.
