



Note From Pastor Bob

Communication is Still the Key

Not long ago I entered into an interesting conversation with a friend. She was not very happy with her brother. He had said something to her during a heated discussion revolving around the proper care of their parents.

The sister lives here locally and the brother lives up north and just two streets down from their parent's home. Thus lies the purpose of their disagreement. The brother feels that he is bearing the burden of his parent's care and that his sister who lives hundreds of miles away is not doing enough.

This disagreement has gone on for a while and now it has begun to escalate. The brother has taken the conversation outside of the words he has shared with his sister and now he has included other siblings along with his parents. When she asked her brother why he did this, he responded, "I wanted the other members of the family to agree with my position."

Now her parents and siblings have cut-off all conversation with her and the entire family seems to be drifting away. My friend has been very hurt by what her brother has done.

Triangulation is a term used to describe when someone reaches outside of a particular situation usually held in confidence to include another party soliciting their support or response to intervene on your behalf.

This is the situation going on in my friend's life. While she and her brother were working through expectations and schedules concerning their parent's care, a breach of confidence had occurred once the brother began including others into their private conversation. His sole reason in doing so was to pit the other family members against his sister so as to rally the troupes to support his position in the conversation.

Sadly, the other family members had no idea what my friend's position in the situation was as the only side of the story they heard was from the brother. An entire family has been broken apart just because someone wanted to be right.

My friend is struggling to find a way to work through this mess and to decide how she can forgive her family.

Paul saw this happening all throughout the early church. Families, friends and short term acquaintances were struggling to find ways to forgive those who had offended them. This ran so rampant through the early church that it had become difficult to identify the believer from the non-believer.

Forgiveness is a difficult thing: especially if you try to do it all on your own. That is why we all need to lean into the Lord for His strength and compassion to help us identify how we can forgive someone when we feel they do not deserve it.

Paul said to the Colossians, "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity." Colossians 3:12-14


