#### PASTOR'S PAGE

We are an Easter people. While living in the presence of sin and death, we are resurrected in faith to face these realities with hope, courage and strength. There are abundant examples of tragedy, evil and terror in this world. Just this last month: a bombing of Christian churches in Egypt; a shooting in Paris; escalated tensions with North Korea; (need I go on?).

This is nothing new. Ten years ago, the Rev. William H. King, Lutheran campus pastor at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University (Virginia Tech), Blacksburg, Va., delivered a message April 17, 2007 at the Virginia Tech Convocation where students, faculty and others of the community gathered to remember the victims of that traumatic shooting on campus. According to the Virginia Tech Web site, at least 33 people died including the gunman.

"We're gathered this afternoon for many purposes. To weep for lost friends and families, to mourn our lost innocence, to walk forward in the wake of unspeakable tragedy, to embrace hope in the shadow of despair, to join our voices and our longing for peace, healing and understanding which is much greater than any single faith community, to embrace that which unifies, and to reject the seductive temptation to hate" said King.

"We cannot undo yesterday's tragic events, but we can sit in patient silence with those who mourn as they seek for a way forward. As we share light one with another, we reclaim our campus. Let us deny death's power to rob us of all that we have loved about Virginia Tech, our community. Let us cast our lot with hope in defiance of despair."

We are an Easter people. This world is not lacking for tragedies – and no community is immune from such heartbreak. Not even Billings. What is truly needed is hope, courage and strength. King's words claim that we cannot discover these traits alone. We gather together.

We gather together...

- to hear God's Word of promise.
- to share our concerns, our fears, our struggles.
- to comfort and encourage one another with our faith and trust.
- to stand against the forces which perpetrate tragedy among us.
- to challenge each other to strive for peace and justice as God would intend.
- to prevent such tragedies from occurring, fully aware of our vulnerability.
- to teach our children how to not only succeed as individuals, but grow as a community.

We are an Easter people. When we gather for worship, education or fellowship, we do far more than fill our individual spirits as we set out into our tasks for the week. We gather to celebrate that Christ is risen and living among us so that we can engage in this beautiful world fraught with tragedy, loneliness, need, and hopelessness. We teach our children – whether related by blood or not – that they are claimed by an awesome God who desires us to cling to hope, courage and strength. That faith is more than a mental exercise, but a way we respond to despair, fearfulness and vulnerability.

Imagine the possibilities of what effect our ministry will have on this community and world! We are indeed an Easter people.

LUTHERAN CENTER ANNUAL MEETING REPORT: Report on the Lutheran Center meeting on March 18,2017. The Lutheran Center "A Home Away From Home" serving people of all faiths. Lodging for medical associated visits to Billings, MT at a nominal fee. Long term stay are encouraged, but they are currently looking at overnight stays as well. The Lutheran Center serves medical patients and their families with an affordable and comfortable home during their hospital stay or outpatient treatments. The house offers physical and emotional respite during stressful times. The ranch style home has five guest rooms including one with a private bath.



Common areas include a living room, dining room, kitchen, two full baths and family room. A chair lift is available for guests with limited mobility. Off street parking is available and laundry facilities are available free of charge. Guests are responsible for cooking their meals and cleaning their rooms at the end of their stay. Wireless internet is also available. The Center has an average occupancy of 53%. Presently there is a current need to pay for the furnace and 3 new toilets that were replaced. Your donations would help pay for these added expenses. Sheryl Scheafer, the president of the Center's board, offered to come and visit to help get the word out about The Lutheran Center at any of our meetings. She can be reached at 208-5611. There are many opportunities for volunteers at the home regarding outside cleanup, mowing, weeding, and etc. Atonement's WELCA Board cleans the Center once a year and we are scheduled for May.
