# PASTOR'S PAGE

First, thank you for your prayers, blessings, cards and gifts upon the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my ordination on May 31<sup>st</sup>. I understand the message went out that was entitled "Super Secret Surprise" – and indeed it was! I was overwhelmed with your kindness, the unexpected generosity, the greetings from former parishioners, thoughts from Teague, the new study Bible – and notably, the stealthy planning of my wife, Trudi (and others).

Two decades of pastoral ministry is a milestone – and an occasion for some reflection. What a joy and privilege it has been to engage in "all the things" that are within the scope of this vocation. I have rejoiced with those who rejoice, grieved with those who grieve, offered comfort and guidance, shared the task of ministry with lay leaders, taught and preached, prayed and wept, communed and laughed. It might be a fun exercise to tally the pastoral acts of baptisms, weddings and funerals – however I'd probably get lost in my thoughts; wondering where all those people are, how they are doing, where their life of faith has carried them.

Most importantly, I have been thinking about what I have learned and how I have grown in my pastoral ministry. Certainly I have received a pastoral and theological foundation from professors and classmates in seminary. And then have been nurtured and mentored by other pastors: an internship supervisor, two senior pastor colleagues, and those in text studies and conferences. From them, I have sought advice, learned from their experience, grown in my knowledge of scripture, have been inspired and humbled.

But those who have shaped my ministry the most have been members of the congregations that I have served. It is from you, that I have learned the depths of sorrow, the breadth of spiritual gifts, the heights of passion for ministry, the diversity of faith expressions, the power of generosity, the complexity of living in community, and the wealth of insight and knowledge. The words of the Apostle Paul have come to life in his gratitude "I give thanks to my God always because of you because of the grace of God that has been given to you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind." I Corinthians 1:4-5.

In every respect, the recognition of such an ordination milestone is a celebration of you – the church. But ultimately, it is an opportunity to give thanks to God for the gift of our community in faith. Together – by the grace of the Father, the love of the Son, and the power of the Holy Spirit – we serve, learn, worship, welcome, and receive... grace and forgiveness, strength and encouragement, mercy and comfort. 

These specialized microphones assist our musicians to project their voices, and allow the musicians to hear themselves, which helps to improve the quality of the music.


