PASTOR'S PAGE

Disturbing images have filled our media in recent weeks and months and it's not just the reports of Islamic terror abroad. It is closer to home: scenes of white supremacists gathering in our communities around the cause of "preserving their heritage" only to fuel already fragile racial tensions; counter-protesters giving in to the maxim of, what Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. referred to as, "Hate begets hate; violence begets violence; and toughness begets a greater toughness."; all resulting in a tragic loss of life - and an even greater tragic loss of human decency, dignity and discourse.

These are troubled times. The Bishop of North Carolina Synod-ELCA, Pastor Tim Smith, shared in a pastoral letter a conversation he had with a colleague who lamented, "It's 2017, and I have to preach a sermon on why Nazism is bad." This lament is a reminder that hatred and evil have always been with us - from the time of Cain and Abel to our modern age - lurking just beneath the surface. But something once again has unleashed them, empowered them, given them permission and encouragement, voice and influence.

Yes, these are troubled times – but there is no greater time to be the church!

The words of the Apostle Paul are fresh in my mind, having just completed a Bible study on Ephesians. In this pastoral letter, Paul addresses a conflicted Christian community with the powerful reminder of God's work in Jesus Christ, "For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us." (2:14) Jesus tears down such dividing walls of racism, sexism, social class, culture and language that prevent us from loving and caring for the neighbor.

Throughout Ephesians, Paul makes it clear that in the waters of our baptism, we are called to "strive together" in God's work in this world through the love of Jesus Christ.

This idea is articulated in the continuation of King's quote "We must meet the forces of hate with the power of love." Now, this is no sentimental, passive, capitulating kind of love. Rather, it is a courageously humble. self-giving, sacrificial, inclusive kind of love. It is a kind of love which affirms that when God declares his love for the world, it is for the whole world. It is a kind of love that compels us to action so that the truth be spoken, evil be denounced, justice be demanded, and peace be pursued.

I will share with you the excerpt from a recently published document entitled, Statement of Lutheran Clergy Rejecting White Supremacy, Terrorism, and Violence. The statement offers a clear denunciation of such evils, yet humbly confesses our collective culpability. It recognizes our tradition's difficult history with racism and bigotry – particularly our history in Nazi Germany when our Lutheran church "sacrificed their faith to nationalistic fervor that betrayed the inclusive nature of the Gospel and became complicit with oppression and violence."

We have an imperfect, flawed and – yes – even sinful history. This behavior has truly been "close to home." Yet, this is no cause to remain silent. We are not imprisoned to our past. God continues to call us out of darkness into light; from death to life; from bondage to freedom. We can do better. With that... I'll conclude with the excerpt:

"...as both Christian leaders and as American citizens who cherish the freedoms of belief, assembly, and speech this country protects, we call upon all leaders - religious, civic, and corporate - to speak out in the clearest of terms to oppose racism, bigotry, and violence whenever and wherever it may happen. Neither our words nor our actions will be perfect, and we will fall short of ideals. Yet speak and act we must, once more dedicating ourselves to the cause of giving "bigotry no sanction [and] persecution no assistance." For when we remain silent, the whole nation suffers and we betray our responsibilities as stewards of the unparalleled religious and political freedoms our nation affords."
