

From The Pastor

"Speak out for those who cannot speak, for the rights of all the destitute. Speak out, judge righteously, defend the rights of the poor and needy." - Proverbs 31:8-9

There is a lively debate in our country about the First Amendment. Can Nazis be kept off college campuses? When does intolerant speech become an incitement to violence? Should hate speech be protected at all?

Some believe in an absolute right to speak, even if hate is what gets said. They fear that anything less gives those with power the leverage to silence those without. Others say that speech that advocates for violence is violence and should never be protected. It's an important debate to have.

But I am a Christian. So, whatever we as Americans decide our Constitution means, I know that my freedom of speech has already been constrained by the God made known in Jesus. Words of discrimination and hate and violence

are out. Likewise, silence in the face of injustice is unacceptable.

Proverbs tells me I have to speak out for those who cannot speak and defend the rights of the poor and needy. James cautions us to not use our words for selfish ambition or deceit, but to speak wisdom which brings about peace, gentleness, mercy and good fruits. Philippians demands I focus on "whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable..."

There are so many scripture passages that teach me how to speak! And others that teach me to be silent. It feels like there's a lot I cannot say – or rather, choose not to waste my energy saying. To make this choice frees me to share a gospel of grace, love and salvation.

As we enter a new year — and this season of Epiphany — let your choice of words declare Emmanuel — God is with us!


