FAMILY PROMISE OF YELLOWSTONE VALLEY

Atonement Lutheran has been affiliated with Family Promise of Yellowstone Valley (formerly known as Interfaith Hospitality Network) since its inception in 2003. We were one of the 13 original congregations, and now have 29 local congregations, with over 1400 volunteers who care for homeless families. The case managers and staff at FP have been able to expand the services, and the success rate of homeless families finding stable housing for a year or more after graduation has risen from 84% to 87% over the past year.

The FP families will again be our guests from March 18th to March 25th this spring. We need Atonement members to help with hosting suppers, sleeping overnight, preparing meals, doing laundry and setting up/tearing down the bedrooms. Please consider helping in one of these ways. If you've never been a part of this, we can pair you with some of our "veteran" hosts. We offer warm beds, warm meals, and warm hearts to families who otherwise may be sleeping in cars. Last month at our Congregation Annual Meeting, our congregation affirmed the importance of youth and family ministry to, not only our current members, but our growing mission to our growing neighborhood, by funding the Youth Ministry Director position in our annual budget. Staff leadership for our program ministry is vital to our intergenerational approach to the faith formation of our congregation – think of our church staff as the engine that keeps us moving forward... and right now we are underpowered!

At the end of 2017, our financial situation gave indication that we could not be able to support the salary for this position in the 2018 budget. Your generosity in December allowed us to finish "in the black," however if we still had Jon Bates, our previous youth director with us, we would have finished the year behind budget. At the meeting last week, we heard quite clearly from the congregation both an affirmation for this position by keeping it in the budget... and the financial challenge that "Yes – we can do this!"

To accomplish this, we are encouraging you, as members of the church, to consider three things:

1. Take a step forward in your giving. Perhaps 1%... or 2%... or whatever you feel the Spirit calling you to do. For some, because of your financial situation, you can't give any more because your generosity is already stretched thin and it is already an act of faith. For that, we say "thank you!" You are a witness to faithful, sacrificial giving – and an inspiration to others! May the rest of us be inspired today! We feel we need to see a monthly surplus in giving of \$4,000 to ensure we'll be able to honor our commitment of supporting this salary.

2. Adjust your current giving distribution percentage between the General Fund and the Building Fund. Currently, our Building Fund has a healthy reserve – and once monies are donated for that purpose, they are restricted in their use. We can't borrow from them or redirect them. But when you redirect a portion of your contributions to the General Fund, you have freed up funds – put "gas in the tank" – for ministry while we gradually draw down the reserves on the Building Fund.

3. Sign up for Simply Giving – which is an option for an electronic transfer of funds which you can control to guarantee consistent, steady support for the ministries of our church. It ensures that our church receives your intended contribution every week, or month, or however you choose, so you don't need to worry about missing the offering plate if the weather is bad, or you're on summer vacation, or forget your envelope on the counter as you head out the door! Currently, we have 49 households, or 17% of giving members in our congregation using Simply Giving. It's our challenge today to increase that percentage to 25% (or 35% ...double?) of our households to get signed up. If you would like more information about this opportunity, there will be members of our newly formed Stewardship Committee at a table in the Commons Area.

Youth Ministry Staffing Update

At the Annual Meeting, the congregation approved funding for a full-time Director of Youth and Family Ministries in the 2018 Annual Budget. However, Church Council wanted to see financial strength to ensure we will be able to sustain the additional salary. (Think of it as somewhere between a "leap of faith" and the Parable of the Wise Builder who must calculate the costs!) Church Council aspires to see a consistent giving surplus of \$4,000/mo. for a few months to ensure we will be able to support this position. In January, we had a wonderful start with a surplus of \$3,440. Thank you for your support – and keep up the good work – we're getting closer to our goal!
