The Vigil Coordinator works directly with the Pastoral Care team to schedule vigil shifts by emailing and calling volunteers. Vigils are sporadic and unpredictable. A volunteer website offers ease in signing up and creating a profile. The website is

also used by the Coordinator to send out a mass recruitment when the need for a vigil has been established. Volunteers may also be contacted by phone if they don't have computer access.

From The Pastor

We are blessed! This past month, Atonement hosted VBS with 80 children and over 20 volunteers providing loving leadership. The building was buzzing with energy as the Good News of Jesus was not only taught, but experienced. The majority of the children were NOT Atonement members, but their friends, relatives... or just neighborhood kids. VBS has long been considered Evangelism as we reach out with the love of Christ to plant the seeds of faith in our community. That's what Evangelism is... teaching, reaching, loving, serving, welcoming. It's at the core of our Education and Youth Ministry.

This summer, we are retooling our Youth Ministry program. Starting in the fall, Youth Ministry will be held on Sunday evenings with the following schedule:

4:00-5:00	Children's Ministry (Grades 3-6)
5:00-5:30	Community Meal (With ALL Youth programs and open to congregation)
5:30-6:00	Combined Game with Confirmation and High School Youth
6:00-7:00	Confirmation (Grades 7-8) in Jerusalem Room
	High School Youth (Grades 9-12) in Youth Room

We are currently crafting our program leadership for each group with part-time paid staff. One role that is needed is a Meal Coordinator since we are serving many kids, plus members of the congregation. So... why a Community Meal? Principally, the strength of our youth ministry at Atonement has always been an intergenerational approach — connecting the generations with one another. Additionally, the long history of the church has been centered on feeding — not only the spirit, but — the body as we gather with friends and strangers alike for fellowship, conversation, laughter and love. Please give prayerful consideration to this leadership role of Meal Coordinator.

This summer, the Campus Planning and Property Teams have been busy preparing for some property improvements, in part to alleviate some unexpected taxes assessed on our undeveloped acreage, but principally to enhance our mission and ministry with usable and beautiful outdoor spaces. The two high priority projects are 1.) Finish landscaping with irrigation and grass around the new connectivity paths between WyndStone and Atonement, and 2.) Recreational lawn space just south of our sanctuary with seeding and irrigation. Both projects will require funding and the budgets are being finalized as I am writing! A rough estimate of the two projects is \$8,000. Outdoor Ministry is also making plans for an archery range backstop, horseshoe pits and a picnic shelter.

While we have some reserve funds that could pay for these improvements, we are also aware that we are entering into the summer months where regular giving to the General Fund often lags. In the past, we have drawn from our reserves to make it through the summer... so if we commit these funds for the improvements, we will run into some "cash flow" issues in these late summer months as we're preparing to launch our fall ministries. So, please consider making the effort of continuing your contributions in these busy summer months ...or sign up for Simply Giving, which is a secure form of electronic giving to ensure consistent financial support. Finally, at the time you receive this newsletter, I'll be in Houston, TX with Jane Hansen and 8 youth as we join about 30,000 other youth and adults at the ELCA National Youth Gathering. I'm excited for this time away with our youth – and hopeful about what they will learn and experience during our time together. Thank you for all your support, prayers and encouragement as we have been preparing for this event. We'll be sharing with the congregation what we've learned, how we've grown, what has challenged us, and where we have seen God at work in and through His amazing Church! We are blessed!
