ADOPT-A-PLOT A BIG SUCCESS

During the Stewardship Campaign in November, the Property Committee introduced a new program called Adopta-Plot. The program is aimed at having congregational members ownership of landscaped "plots" for weeding, trimming, and general upkeep. The plots were sized to allow for completion of a section over several hours. The plot would be owned by that member or family and will need to be kept up throughout the year during 2019. The Property Committee will supply guidelines for the upkeep, such as how far to cut down the grasses and how much of a bush should be trimmed, providing consistency from one plot to another.

The Atonement landscaped property was divided into over 30 plots. Twentyseven congregational families signed up to take care of these plots. As spring nears, the assignments will be posted distributed with guidelines provided. With the enormous increase in grassy areas requiring mowing, the Property Committee would like to thank each and every volunteer for their commitment to keeping our grounds in great shape. FROM THE PASTOR

With the turn of our calendar, we have not only entered a New Year, but entered a new liturgical Season of the Church. January 6 commences the season of Epiphany – symbolized by stars and candles and lamps and other brilliant lights! They point beyond themselves to multifaceted revelations of God's Good News emanating into this world: Jesus, the Light of the World; the Word of God bringing light into darkness; our baptismal identity which calls us to "let our light shine before others" – just to name a few.

At our staff meeting last month, Julie Amundson shared a devotion as we began our conversation. It came from her study Bible... and it struck me as being wonderfully relevant to this season of the liturgical year — and this season of life in our congregation. Based on Luke 11:33 "No one lights a lamp and puts it in a place that will be hidden, or under a bowl. Instead they put it on a stand, so that those who come in may see the light." The devotion contained a story and I'll paraphrase the parable below:

In a certain mountain village in Europe several centuries ago, a nobleman wondered what legacy to leave his townspeople. At last he decided to build them a church. Nobody saw the complete plans until the church was finished. When people gathered, they were amazed at its dimension, grandeur, and beauty. But one person noticed an incompleteness. "Where are the lamps?" he asked. "How will the church be lighted?" The nobleman smiled and opened a crate filled with lamps which he then distributed to each household. "Each time you are here, the area in which you sit will be lighted. But when you are not here, some part of God's house will be dark."

This simultaneously reveals a profound affirmation — that your very presence is a glimmer of light and hope for others to see — and an unassuming challenge — that your very presence is a glimmer of light and hope for others to see! It speaks of the gift of faith received, and the gift of faith given to others through you. At the same time, an acknowledgement of God's grace, and a call to mission and purpose in and through our church.

A number of years ago, this congregation wondered what kind of legacy it would leave for our growing community. The decision to relocate to 1290 Sierra Granda Boulevard was but a symbol of that legacy. Because it's not the building itself that is the legacy, but those who gather here... and what we do here. That's the legacy – to be an active, thriving resource that will humbly and graciously serve our members, the neighborhood, the community and beyond! And truth be told, we cannot do it without you – again, a profound affirmation of your worth in this community, and an unassuming challenge to engage in this vibrant community.

In this New Year, may you discover fresh opportunities to boldly claim your lamp and "let your light shine before other so that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven."
