FROM THE PASTOR

I'm excited! This last month, we had a series of New Member classes with 8 households with age groups ranging from preschoolers to retirees. It's a wonderfully diverse group of folks from a variety of backgrounds, experiences, and interests. I find it a pleasure hearing their stories, responding to their questions, and praying that we may be good partners with them in their faith journey.

I've been pondering the nature of a church lately. Partly because of the New Members. Partly because of the ministries we offer. Some, because of the many in our membership that we regularly don't see. But mostly, because of some Bible devotions that I've been doing recently. It's always interesting listening deeply to scripture's description of the church. There's always an "otherness" to it. We gather not solely to "get our spiritual fill," but to serve the other, encourage the other, inspire the other, work with the other, pray for the other. From the teachings of Jesus to the Letters of Paul to the Old Testament community of Israel... every time I read the Bible, I can't escape the "otherness" that scripture talks about again and again.

It struck me hard this last month. Two funerals. One for an older adult who's death was expected. The other, a tragic loss of a young man that no one expected, himself included. In both these instances, I was reminded of our common task of bringing support and comfort, hope and healing, compassion and love. It has long been the calling of the church to (as the Apostle Paul describes in Romans 12) offer ourselves for one another, bear one another's burdens, think of others before our own needs, extend hospitality to the strangers, rejoice with those who rejoice... and weep with those who weep. There it is again... that otherness.

There are all kinds of people in the church. Folks who show up about every Sunday. Some, only when they feel their "cup is empty" and need a refill. Believe it or not, some think of the church only as "consumers" – you know... not really thinking they have anything to give, but just in terms of getting what they need: the compulsory baptism, education for the kids, be on call for their crisis. For others, Christmas and Easter is about it. It's my prayer that the folks who only come on rare occasion might discover the true joy and community that this place offers – and perhaps those who approach the church as "consumers" might discover the spiritual joy and transformational power when they truly learn to be "givers."

But here's the reality (that is borne from the Good News), every time we come to church... no matter what our agenda for showing up... we serve as an inspiration for others who find their way through these doors. Just by showing up, we embody the presence of God in this world. We offer words of comfort and healing for those who need it. We sing the songs that others don't have the strength or heart to sing. We lift each other to new heights. We draw each other up from great depths.

And... we prepare ourselves to be those who will one day receive consolation. Because one day, we will receive "bad news." One day, we will grieve. One day, it will only be by the strength of the church surrounding us that we'll have the strength to stand. One day, we will need the very support that we ourselves have been offering to others. And having shared that love, hope and mercy to others – we will receive tenfold. That's it. That's what I've been learning about the nature of the church lately. If you've been thinking about it lately yourself, I'd love to have us ponder and learn about it together. Peace in Christ,
