### FROM YOUR CHURCH COUNCIL

UPDATE - ON-SITE WORSHIP SERVICES

As you know, we have resumed on-site worship at Atonement on June 7<sup>th</sup>. Kristin La Ve' led the service with communion on the 7<sup>th</sup> and it was very well received. All in attendance were very glad to participate in worship, see some familiar faces (even if masked) and a chance to exchange some conversation or greetings before and after the service. So far, the attendance at services has been around 40 people. We hope to see more attend as time goes on and that we are able to continue with on-site services without interruption in the future. We also encourage you to continue to connect with Atonement by viewing the services live on Facebook at 9:15 am Sunday morning or on YouTube at your convenience.

We have been having a Zoom coffee hour. It has been lightly attended (3 or 4 households so far), but has led to some nice interaction and conversation with Atonement family that we have not seen for a few months. We encourage you all to join the Zoom coffee or feel free to form a group coffee hour with some of your Atonement friends that you would often visit during normal coffee hour time. We may be trying an outdoor coffee fellowship after the 9:15 service. Possibly as soon as June 28<sup>th</sup>. It will probably involve social/physical distancing and bringing your own coffee and lawn chairs. This is the current safe health guideline for coffee fellowship. Watch for further information.

#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

On paper, our financial standing looks very positive right now. However, if you look closely at the financial report table, you can see that our member giving YTD has not met our expenses. Our current good standing is the result of receiving the \$61,545 in government assistance through the Small Business Association Payroll Protection Plan program.

We have been tracking the use of those SBI-PPP funds for payroll, utilities and mortgage interest through June 9<sup>th</sup>. We are confident that the way in which those funds have been disbursed will lead to 100% forgiveness of this loan. However, the loan funds were used up on schedule as of June, 9<sup>th</sup> and now we will be relying solely on member giving to meet our expenses through the rest of this uncertain time. Atonement will need your help.

During the summer months we usually see a drop in giving. The Finance Committee and Council is concerned about the health of the church income in these crucial months ahead. As a means of continuing to communicate our financial concerns, in the coming months there will be a cork board in the Commons Area with slips of paper attached detailing some of the church expenses we feel may need some extra help. If you feel like you could help, please take one or two of the slips that addresses an area you would like to help. Return it with your donation. The slips of paper will resemble a \$20 Bill and note the specific need such as "\$20.00 for Pastoral Help" or "\$20.00 for Utilities/Water" or "\$20.00 for Utilities/Internet". Any contributions made in this way will be directed toward that particular expense. Even if you are not attending services due to COVID-19 currently, you can come in and visit the church and say hello to staff anytime during office hours and possibly participate in this challenge to meet our financial needs.

### **CHRISTIKON UPDATES**

COVID-19 changed much in our lives and world. As we prepare to welcome you to camp this summer, we need your help to minimize the risk of infection by following the recommendations below prior to and while attending camp. If you have any illness symptoms before departing for camp, please do not board the bus or travel up to camp until they clear and you have spoken with me.

For 2 weeks prior to arriving at camp:

Please take and record your temperature daily, and bring that log with you to camp. Minimize your exposure to others by staying at home as much as possible and avoiding large group activities (more than 10), and wearing a facemask when you do go out. While at camp and/or riding the bus:

Wear a facemask, and bring another with you. We do have a good supply up here, but not enough for all guests all summer.

If you can, please bring your own bottle of hand sanitizer.

Summer staff have followed the same process before they arrived, and commit to spending the entire summer up at camp and not heading to town during breaks.

### FROM YOUR CHURCH COUNCIL (cont.)

#### STRATEGIC PLAN MEETING

The council met on Saturday morning, June 20<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am to resume work on the Strategic Plan. Unfortunately, our attention has been centered on our response to the COVID-19 pandemic for the last 3 months. It is time to work on this plan again, and give our various committees and groups some direction as we approach Phase 3 of "reopening" and activities increase around the Church. The purpose of this meeting will be to review and update the Strategic Plan for Atonement and then communicate that information out for committees to address/include in their activity and planning.

#### UPDATE ON GROUPS USING ATONEMENT FOR MEETINGS/ACTIVITIES

Some groups that use the Atonement facilities are considered essential. These are primarily two AA groups. Right now, our direction to those groups is to use the commons area and commons restroom only, bring in their own chairs and then clean/disinfect before they leave. The facilities are open for all Atonement groups or committees to meet. We ask that you let the office know if your committee/group has not been meeting and is ready to starting again. Please do not meet in the Sanctuary between Thursday Evening and Sunday Noon for cleaning/sanitation for the Sunday service. The Kitchen should be off limits after 11 AM Saturday until Sunday at 9 AM. Meetings on Saturday in the church are appropriate if completed by 2 PM. Your group can meet on-site, by zoom or a combination of zoom and on-site. If/when you meet, please remember to submit your committee meeting minutes to Jan Westrope.

We have two out of state groups that are scheduled to stay overnight at Atonement on their way to Christikon. Two other groups that had scheduled an overnight stay have cancelled their plans to do so. The group that still plans to stay is from Ellsworth WI and is scheduled to stay on Friday, July 10<sup>th</sup> and the other is from Cold Spring, MN staying on Saturday, July 18<sup>th</sup>. Since they are small groups (6 students and 2 adults) and were scheduled before the COVID -19 pandemic began, Council approved their overnight stay, limiting their use of the building to the Jerusalem Room, Youth Room and bathrooms. Cleaning of these rooms will take place prior to Sunday service.

#### **Charles Bott**

Charles is a native Oklahoman, born in Ponca City and raised and educated in Stillwater and Tulsa. He attended Oklahoma State University and graduated from the University of Tulsa with a BA in Industrial Psychology.

He retired in 2013 after a 45 year career in real estate mortgage lending and brokerage. He received his license as a Lay Pastoral Associate (LPA) in 2004, and completed his on-campus seminary studies at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, CA and Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN in 2012. He elected not to pursue formal ordination thereafter. He retired again in 2019 after 11 years as Presiding Minister at First American Lutheran Church in Hardin, MT. He has been a member of Atonement since 1994.

He was set up with a blind date in New Orleans, LA in July of 1979. That turned out to be his last, and best, date ever. He and Jo celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary this past April, 2020. Their celebratory trip to Scotland and Ireland was wiped out by COVID-19, but hope springs eternal for a do-over next year. He and Jo have a son, James, and daughter-in-law, Maggie, living in Peyton, CO, and a daughter, Angela, and grandson, Caleb, in Billings. Their daughter, Tiffany, passed away in 2010.

He is presently a substitute teacher at the middle school and high school level in Billings, continues to be available as a substitute minister, and still pursues his favorite avocation as a baseball and softball umpire, an addiction he has enjoyed since 1977.

The 2020-2021 preschool year is right around the corner! We are excited for next year and taking enrollment for the 2020-2021 school year!



### GOD'S WORK, OUR HANDS 9.13.20


