STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

God is good. All the time. We continue to be amazed with gratitude for our Atonement members in their generous giving to carry on our overall goal of living our mission of Bringing the Hope We Share in Christ to All.

The financial picture for Atonement continues to be very challenging and complex. The combined giving for 2020 to all funds (General, Building and Capital Campaign) exceeds 2019 totals to this date. We are so grateful for this. That is an incredible fact considering the current circumstances that we are enduring.

However, our general income from members has not met our budgeted expenses for six of the nine months this year. As noted in the Commentator, our YTD income (January through October) is -\$13,161. The Finance Committee is very concerned about the financial stability of Atonement Lutheran. We are aware that much of our financial shortfall is related to COVID-19. We have already distributed the received Payroll Protection Plan funds from the federal government. This federal money was required to be used for payroll and other necessary costs during the pandemic, such as utilities and mortgage interest.

We will be monitoring this situation closely as we approach year-end. It's likely the pandemic has financially impacted some people's charitable giving. However, one day this too shall pass – and we need our church to be there to support us through it all... and into the future. For those who have abundance, please consider sharing more while others may not be able. Also, please know that your church family is here to support you with whatever needs may arise. Please call the church office for any questions or needs.

These figures reflect the Church finances based on member contributions only. Federal PPP (\$61,545.60) money not used after the month of June. Member giving has covered church expenses only 4 of the 10 months, through October 2020. Also covered Building Fund expenses only 1 of the same 10 months. August total shortfall (General and Building funds) from members (\$6,732.99). September total shortfall (General and Building funds) from members (\$7,953.78). October total shortfall (General and Building Fund) from members (\$793.12).
