GROWING THE SEEDS OF FAITH YEAR 1

Atonement members - We have completed an amazing first year of the Growing the Seeds of Faith Capital Campaign. To summarize this first year (through November 17, 2020) with some rounded numbers (nearest \$100): Total giving for year 1 - \$165,000!!!

\$2,100/mo. set aside to fund the Youth and Family director position (**\$27,300** total - 13 months/2 Novembers)

\$13,500 set aside to distribute to tithe gift recipients (Christikon, Family Promise and Friendship House). This means that each of these tithe gift recipients will receive a gift of **\$4,500** from Atonement's members through this Capital Campaign!!

\$124,000 for debt reduction resulting in a reduction of **\$678** in our monthly mortgage payment!!

The members of Atonement are to be commended for your deep commitment to both the General and Building Fund giving and your support for this additional giving to the Capital Campaign. You have done this in the most challenging of times. We will celebrate these accomplishments with a video update at our January 3 (Epiphany Sunday) service. Please tune in on-line!

FROM THE PASTOR

Never in my life...

Never in my life have I wanted a year to come to an end like I have for 2020. It was filled with thwarted plans, profound disappointments, unwelcomed adjustments, anxious dis-ease, and heartbreaking disease. While I have been chief among the optimists that have tried to sew silver linings into the inky clouds, I've long since lost both my energy and appetite to do so. There have been some mornings that I've unfurled the paper and the bad news du jour has been either met with a shrug or at most a sighing mutter with the words, "What now?" And the thought of doing anything resembling long-range planning still feels like an exercise in futility.

I'm not alone. If you have found yourself in that spot, then you are also with me in my eager hope for the coming year. While we won't be through the days of pandemic until late spring (if the predictors of such things are correct), I'm confident that by the time we turn the next year's calendar, we'll have resumed some semblance of normalcy. That excites me. It's part of what keeps my moving forward.

But the greater motivation has been found in the words of the Apostle Paul.

While writing to the church in Corinth, he offered words of encouragement to a community also languishing in troubled days. Their dis-ease was different than ours, but dis-ease nonetheless. And in the midst of it, they were feeling sorry for themselves – like they were suffering some great injustice – acting as if God had abandon them – and it was each person for themselves. They were tending to their own personal interests and had been reluctant to sacrifice of themselves for the common good.

All of this led the Apostle Paul to write a powerful treatise on the resurrection of the body where in the middle of it, he makes this stunning observation, "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied." (1 Cor. 15:19) Paul is calling me to name my self-centered pity, call it out, and let it... die. Yes, the life of the year 2020 will come to an end – it will die. But 2021 will have sorrows of its own.

What I am being called to do is to let that Old Adam in me die. Bury the cynicism. The grievances. The indifference. The sense of personal inconvenience. The self-pity. All of it. Let it die. For in Christ there is a resurrection, and that cannot happen until I turn the page, let go of the things of this world, and let the hope that is in Christ open my heart to a new life, a new day, a new joy... and a New Year.

Anyone else want to join me?
