## FROM THE PASTOR

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace, who brings good news, who announces salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns." Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices, together they sing for joy; for in plain sight they see the return of the LORD to Zion. Break forth together into singing, you ruins of Jerusalem; for the LORD has comforted his people, he has redeemed Jerusalem. Isaiah 52

I'm feeling a little bit of the sense of joy God's people had as they returned to the Promised Land following their time of Exile in Babylon. After their long departure from the familiar, they return – renewed in their devotion to God and resilient from that which they have endured. There were tears of joy, songs of thanksgiving and prayers of gratitude that filled not only their lips, but hearts and souls as well. (If you ever want to read about it, study Ezra, Nehemiah, and the last 14 chapters of Isaiah.)

On March 14<sup>th</sup>, we held our first in-person worship service following our departure from worship in the sanctuary. I eagerly watched out the doors as I saw the familiar faces walking up the sidewalk. How beautiful were their feet (and that which they carried into our place of worship)! The masks over their mouths and noses couldn't obscure the smiles that radiated in their eyes. Yes, there were some tears: tears of sorrow for what we have missed over these long months, tears of joy to see friends and strangers, tears of hope as we step into this next chapter of our church life.

As with those returning from Exile knew, there will be a lot of "rebuilding" to do. Our ministry groups have been idle for far too long. Some folks have just "gotten out of the habit" of worship, study, and service. In this last year, some pretty important people in positions of leadership and service have died. There's a whole mix of emotion of what pausing much of our program ministry has meant — some grief, some disappointment and anger, some gratitude that we made the right decision, and more. All of that will need to be named, claimed, and healed.

But the one clear message that this month brings is that  $God - \underline{our} God - is$  One of resurrection and new life. Death and sin and brokenness and despair will always give way to life and forgiveness and healing and hope. The joy of Easter is the great culmination of new life that God gives to his beloved people. Join us this month as we share in that joy!

## GROWING THE SEEDS OF FAITH CAPITAL CAMPAIGN OVERVIEW NOVEMBER 2019 - FEBRUARY 2021

The campaign is roughly 45% complete in terms of the 3 year time frame.

#### **Capital Campaign Giving vs. Campaign Pledge Amounts**

#### Big Accomplishments for Growing the Seeds of Faith Capital Campaign so far:

- > 39% of the overall campaign goal of \$550,000 has been contributed
- > 52.4% of the total pledged amount has been contributed (including unpledged contributions)
- > \$12,202 in unpledged contributions (5.7% of giving thus far)
- > \$215,473 total giving through February of 2021
- Mortgage principal balance reduced to below \$1,000,000 as of January 2021!!
- ➤ Mortgage payment reduction of \$680/month with 10% principal paid down in 2020 (paying lower interest)
- Ongoing support of Youth Director for Atonement Staff and community tithe ministries

#### Looking ahead at Growing the Seeds of Faith Capital Campaign:

- Overall we are doing very well, but work remains to meet the full goal of \$550,000 (still our total goal!)
- We will continue to qualify for mortgage adjustments each year that we pay down the principal balance by 10% or more. We need about \$100,000 in debt reduction to qualify in 2021 and are well on our way!
- Review your pledge. We encourage your fulfillment of that pledge as we work toward meeting totals that have been pledged and the larger initial goal of the campaign.
- Thank you! Thank you! For your support thus far and for all that you will consider to help Atonement reach these Capital Campaign goals.
- We will celebrate the goals we have met thus far and share more information about the Growing the Seeds of Faith Capital Campaign at the Sunday services on April 18.

#### ATONEMENT CLEAN-UP DAY

At 9AM on April 17th, Atonement will be having our first Cleanup Day of the year both outside and inside the church. With the pandemic, we have many areas needing attention, as we continue to maintain social distancing and masking. Immediate families can work together in close proximity.

Outside will consist of washing all outside windows, trimming shrubs, weeding, mowing as needed, fertilizing, watering trees, picking rocks, testing sprinklers, planting new trees, and sweeping gutters.

The Adopt-a-Plot program still needs foster families to adopt and care for some landscaping. Areas available include:

- The rock by the new Black Hills spruce donated by Jake Ketterling, with the intent to downsize the area that another family has been managing.
- The two ditch drains need reassigning.
- The "V" area of rock close to the roundabout needs a volunteer family to weed as needed.
- The area around the archery range could use some TLC, if a family is willing.
- The island closest to the mailbox also needs reassigning.
- And the grass and bush corner area just outside the youth room is up for grabs.

Posters will be displayed in the Commons as a reminder of all areas assigned as time approaches. Please bring lawn tools including bush trimmers, brooms, shovels, etc. If you plan to wash outside windows; squeegees, buckets, rags and step ladders.

Inside the church in the bathrooms and kitchen, the floor drains will need to be flushed to maintain adequate drainage. Since the list is long, if members are available, we will continue on Sunday afternoon April 18th for work that is not completed Saturday. Thank you to all members that are willing to volunteer to get our church grounds looking well groomed.
