The whole congregation was asked to help with completing the Site Profile by filling out a survey that was recently sent out for your input on 10 important qualifications of the new pastor. We have taken the survey results and added them to our Ministry Site Profile and have completed the first draft of our documents. The next step will be to finalize our Site Profile and submit it to the Synod. After that we wait to hear back if there are currently candidates that may be a good fit for our congregation.

Congratulations on the past two years of the Growing the Seeds of Faith Capital Campaign (GTSofFCC)!! As we enter the third year of this campaign, please celebrate and consider the wonderful things we have accomplished and will continue to accomplish because of this campaign:

- Tithe gifts to three local ministries: Family Promise, Christikon and Friendship House
 - o Total estimated amount given of \$23,000 by end of 2021
- Creation and funding of our own Director of Youth and Family staff position
- Reduction of the Mortgage on our Church Home
 - Mortgage balance reduced by approximately \$300,000 (\$191,000 Cap Camp., \$79,000 mortgage payments and about \$30,000 in other onetime donations)
- Monthly payments reduced from \$8,150 per month to \$6,500 per month

GROWING THE SEEDS OF FAITH (CONT.)

As we approach the third and final year of this Capital Campaign, we pray for the same impact on all three areas of our targeted Capital Campaign ministries. However, as the Campaign concludes in November of next year, the three Capital Campaign goals and objectives also conclude. This means that continued funding of the Youth and Family position will need to be supported from the General Fund. In addition, through our lending agency, Mission Investment Fund, Atonement has received a free loan amortization each year of the campaign as we have been able to pay down yearly 10% of the remaining loan balance. The effort to reach these milestones and mortgage payment adjustments continues to help us save a significant amount in the interest we pay on our mortgage.

With these factors in mind, the Capital Campaign Team is asking...what would happen if the GTSofFCC is extended another year? How could we continue to receive the annual 10% principal reduction incentive to further the debt reduction? What options/strategies might help us maintain the benefits we are seeing now because of the GTSofFCC? While the Capital Campaign Team thinks the idea of extending the Campaign another year is worth considering, this is a decision that all Atonement members should have ample time to consider and vote upon at an Annual Meeting or at a separate special congregational meeting. The Capital Campaign team with support from the Council would like to include discussion of these ideas and possible the benefits that they would provide to Atonement.

The Capital Campaign Team knows the past two years has been anything but average. However, your support for the Campaign has never wavered and we cannot thank you enough. We look forward to another great year and wish you and your family many blessings this Christmas season.
