PREPARATION

war, and victims of violence.

Leader: Now, let us rise up and interpret these rushing waters of violence that leave

children wounded and paralyzed. Let us rise up and demand abolishment of laws that are rooted in militarism, fueled by capitalism and justified by racism.

Assembly: We will rise up against laws that are rooted in evil that have neither

concern for life, nor any concern for Your love. We will rise up until justice rolls on like a river and righteousness like a never failing stream.

Leader: Oh Lord, we commit ourselves to seeing all children the way that you see them.

No matter their age or race, they are precious gifts made in your image, created

with transformative purpose and beauty.

Assembly: And for that cause, we pledge to be hedges of protection for their lives,

we pledge to stand against anything that threatens their potential or

promise.

ALL: We embody the spirit of Ubuntu, I am because we are and because we

are, I am." Therefore, we pledge to lock arms and witness the birth of the next great generation. We will occupy the heart. We will be free at last.

STRENGTH TO BE FREE

"Give me the strength to be free." The thought of being free comes upon us sometimes with such power that under its impact we lose the meaning that the thought implies. Often, "being free" means to be where we are not at the moment, to be relieved of a particular set of chores or responsibilities that are bearing heavily upon minds, to be surrounded by a careless rapture with no reminders of costs of any kind, to be on the open road with nothing overhead but the blue sky and whole days in which to roam. For many, "being free" means movement, change, reordering.

To be free may not mean any of these things. ... Often to be free means the ability to deal with the realities of one's situation so as not to be overcome by them. It is the manifestation of a quality of being and living that results not only from understanding of one's situation but also from wisdom in dealing with it. It takes no strength to give up, to accept shackles of circumstance so that they become shackles of soul, to shrug the shoulders in bland acquiescence. This is easy. But do not congratulate yourself that you have solved anything. In simple language, you have sold out, surrendered, given up. It takes strength to affirm the high prerogative of your spirit. And you will find that if you do, a host of invisible angels will wing to your defense, and the glory of the living God will envelop your surroundings because in you He has come into His own.

THE FACES OF JESUS

THE FACES OF JESUS is the title of one of my favorite books. In its two hundred plus pages it depicts images of Jesus that reflect the way in which all people tend to see him as a person with features and characteristics like themselves. Whether the appearance is African, Asian, European or otherwise there is no doubt of the common effort to capture a picture of the one we attempt to follow in our faith. This became especially clear for us at Metropolitan when Dr. Charles McGruder was inspired to sculpt the "whosoever" statue overlooking our baptismal pool. When he first brought it into the sanctuary all of us immediately recognized its beauty, but at the same time we realized that it was not consistent with our endeavor to not have ethnic-specific images of Christ. Initially I was reluctant to say anything about my concern for fear of insulting the artist. However, when I did bring it to his attention he understood perfectly and took his wonderful work of art back to the studio where he transformed it to reflect the spirit of our community of believers. Even though it was beautiful before, we all agreed that its magnificence was enhanced by the fact that everyone who looked into the perfectively reworked face of Jesus could see their own face. If, like the Greeks in John 12:21&22, there were those who came looking for Jesus today might they be able to see in us the face of Our Lord such that we might be for them THE FACES OF JESUS.
