ARE YOU SITTING DOWN?

After this Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. ²A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. ³Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. ⁴Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. ⁵When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" ⁶He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. ⁷Philip answered him, "Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." 8One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, ⁹"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" 10Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so they sat down, about five thousand in all. ¹¹Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted. ¹²When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost." ¹³So they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. ¹⁴When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world."

¹⁵When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself. ¹⁶When evening came, his disciples went down to the sea, ¹⁷got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. ¹⁸The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. ¹⁹When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified. ²⁰But he said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid." ²¹Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land toward which they were going. *John 6:1-21*

THE JESUS FACTOR

THE JESUS FACTOR represents an aspect of life which is not regularly included in our calculations of what is or is not possible. In today's text, John 6:1-21, when Jesus asked the question, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat," the answer Philip gives does not seem to appreciate who is doing the asking. With all of the great advancements and accomplishments in the world there are still many critical issues that go unaddressed just because of our disregard for THE JESUS FACTOR. In reading the teachings of Jesus we see clear evidence of how his interventions transform the impossible into the possible. Thus, as the body of Christ, we should not stand on the sideline of life and silently accept the world's determination of things being impossible when THE JESUS FACTOR has not been added to the equation. If we apply THE JESUS FACTOR to health care reform there would be no such thing as people having to endure the devastation of sickness without having avenues to wellness. Likewise, THE JESUS FACTOR, with its uncompromising love for all of humankind, could help us to see our way to address the complexities of poverty, violence, education, marriage, gender, sexuality, racism and all of the other issues that seem to be beyond our ability to deal with. There is no limit to the application of THE JESUS FACTOR.
