WHAT REALLY MATTERS

²⁴From there he set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, ²⁵but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. ²⁶Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. ²⁷He said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." ²⁸But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." ²⁹Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter." ³⁰So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

³¹Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. ³²They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. ³³He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. ³⁴Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." ³⁵And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. ³⁶Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. ³⁷They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak." *Mark 7:24-37*

FELLOWSHIP CIRCLE

There are at least two areas of need in which all people are involved. One is the insistence upon finding something to worship. There is something native to the human spirit that insists upon the offering of one's precious gifts, precious possessions, to something outside of oneself, something that is regarded as supremely worthful. What do **you** worship? To what do you bring the most precious increments of your spirit, your mind and your possessions? Whatever it is that holds so central a place in your reaction to living, that is your God!

There is also the need of being a part of the human family, the human race. I am aware that all the race, in one very meaningful sense, breathes through me – I am part of the very pulsating rhythm of existence. I am not a thing apart; I am not a separate unit. If I am cut off so that only my little life breathes through me, only my little hopes course through my mind and spirit, only my little thoughts penetrate my brain, then life for me is not worth living. I must have a sense of deep corporate vitality. Therefore, I must manage somehow to keep the lines of communication open between me and the human family. How wonderful it is if I can do this by love, by warmth, by kindling flame of abiding fellowship! Often, if it cannot be done that way, there is resort to hate, to antagonism, to belligerency. The shouting of defiance is the call of my heart for kinship. If a person cannot become the center of an increasing affection, in desperation they become the core of a great rejection. For better or for worse, there is but one family under God and I am a member of it.

EVERY PLACE YOU SET FOOT

"EVERY PLACE YOU SET FOOT" was promised by God to be the territory the Israelites would occupy as long as they "diligently observed the entire commandment" they had been given. The promise was claimed and translated into the immediate movement towards seizing the land of many people, but the mandated criteria to do so in the spirit of "loving the Lord your God, and serving God with all of your heart and with all your soul" got lost along the way. Through Jesus this word became flesh as he took his ministry beyond the boundaries that fragment and divide humankind. His encounter with the Syrophoenician woman came about as he ministered in a part of the world that was not common ground for his people. The stumbling blocks of tradition, custom and cultural misunderstanding translated into a situation where the miraculous possibility of the moment was almost lost. However, Jesus' capacity to respond with compassion and unconditional love teaches us a lesson that we desperately need to learn. Our claim to be "more than conquerors" needs to be understood in the context of our responsibility to "share God's love with the world." Just as we see Jesus in Mark 7:24-37 moving to chart new territory, we too must go forward with a sense of urgency to demonstrate God's radically inclusive love, humbly accepting the promise in the words "EVERY PLACE YOU SET FOOT."
