BE PREPARED

BE PREPARED is a statement most often associated with the Boy Scout motto. It is a simple statement, yet it has profound implications for our ability to deal effectively with every aspect of life. In an ordinary way, the application of this motto is very much a part of my experience in traveling. The practice of having a suitcase always packed with all of my essentials in place allows me to have some degree of assurance that when I arrive at my destination, I will have all of the medicines, toiletries, clothing, accessories and other items I need. Certainly, none of us can anticipate everything we will have to deal with in life, but there are some things for which we need to be prepared. For those of us who are followers of Christ, we should always be living in a posture of expectation regarding the return of our Lord and it is clear that we need to BE PREPARED. The Hebrew Bible, especially through the voices of the prophets, gives us tremendous insight into how the people of God worked for centuries to BE PREPARED for the coming of Christ. Now it is our voices that the world needs to hear in order to make ready for the second coming. We don't know the day or the hour, but we do know there are injustices that need to be addressed, truths that need to be spoken, peace that needs to be established, reconciliation that needs to occur and love that needs to be expressed. In this season of Advent and beyond, there is no shortage of things for us to do in order to BE PREPARED.
