THE INNER NEED FOR LOVE

There is a direct continuity between the need to be loved, to be deeply cared for, and the heart, the very pulse beat of the individual's experience of God in the religious encounter. Here the individual is laid bare, stripped of all façade – what I am in and of myself is finally dealt with. The person has a sense of being touched at their deepest center, at their very core, and all other experiences of love are but imitations of this great experience. All other experiences of love at other levels are what may be regarded as "readying" experiences for the great and tremendous experience which is the significant element in the religious experience itself. This is the essence of the meaning of the love of God. In the presence of God, at last, a person is relieved of all necessity for pretending. They can stand clean in the sense of being undisguised and utterly without shame. This does not mean that limitations are overlooked, that sins are no longer sins, but it does mean that anything less than the very core of one's being is not quite relevant. To be touched *there* is to be placed in a position to have one's life thoroughly examined, thoroughly explored, but from the center, the ultimate point of reference within the individual. There is nothing that cannot be dealt with here. There is nothing that cannot be handled or encompassed from this point of leverage. There is nothing that cannot be understood, placed in this perspective of the event and the logic of one's own life. What happens here truly happens. The religious experience carries with it the judgment that this encounter with God is completely exhaustive and all-comprehending.

POTHOLES

POTHOLES are everywhere. Whether you are on the interstate, main streets, side streets, back streets or even the church parking lot, there are POTHOLES that make our movement from one place to another difficult. In this week's text, Luke 13:31-35, Jesus is teaching, "casting out demons and performing cures" while he is making his way to Jerusalem to deal with his ultimate confrontation on Calvary. He had made the pilgrimage to Jerusalem many times before, but this time was unlike any he had ever experienced. This would be his last trip and the challenges he had to face along the way were considerable. Threats from Herod, scheming by the leaders of his own faith community and the overwhelmingly negative history of prophets in the city he was making his way towards were all converging to add heightened drama to his journey. I think a good metaphor for these looming issues is that they were like POTHOLES he had to negotiate his way over and around. The hazards that our personal POTHOLES create for us as we travel through life are many, but when we have a clear sense of mission that is born out of a calling from God we learn to deal with the "bumps in the road" victoriously. As we walk with The Lord through this season of Lent, I pray that we will learn from him how to be tough enough to "speak truth to power" and gentle enough to be seen "as a hen who gathers her brood under her wings" while we deal with life's POTHOLES. Thanks to the spirit established by our founders thirty-eight years ago, our congregation has done a pretty good job of working our way around the POTHOLES.
