FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends:

A major part of the journey through Lent is the effort to honestly appraise where we are in our faith, in our relationship with God and with one another, in our discipleship as followers of Jesus Christ. Hopefully the church provides good opportunities and the encouragement to do all that.

Implicit in that process is our need to listen for God's voice and to hear what God might be trying to say to us. And I suspect that God has lots to say to every one of us. Indeed, like the popular phone commercial on TV, God keeps asking, "Can you hear me now?" If you read through the gospel of Mark you almost get the idea that God repeatedly asked that question of Jesus:

"Can you hear me say that you are my beloved son, even now in the midst of your temptations?"

"Can you hear me now that you know that you won't be spared, but offered up for the world's sin?"

"Can you hear me in the angels that I send to wait on you?"

And I think God is still asking those questions, only now they are addressed to all of us. Can we hear that the one who was with Jesus is also with us for the long haul, even when we're in the wilderness? Can we recognize the angels God sends to 'wait table' on us? Can we hear God's call to us to be the angels who accompany others in their lonely and desolate places?

I hope and pray that as we make our way through this season of Lent together we can help each other to listen more carefully and to hear much better. So that when we arrive at Good Friday and Easter there will be no doubt that we've gotten the message. Which, of course, is very good news!

"PEACE AND JOY" BUILDS IN JUNE

For each of the last three summers Wayside has been one of the "core" churches that supported the Habitat for Humanity "House that Faith Built," "House That Hope Built," and "House That Love Built" projects. In one brief three-week period each year a complete house was built and dedicated by workers from various churches (more than 40) in our community. All three were great efforts and very rewarding to all those who participated.

This summer Habitat has something even more unique. During the 'blitz build' in June two houses will be built, side-by-side and adjacent to the three listed above. Construction on the "House That Joy Built" and the "House that Peace Built" will begin on Monday, June 4th with the Dedication Ceremony scheduled for the 24th of that month. Wayside will be granted at least five worker slots on one of the weeks of the build. NEWS FROM THE OUTREACH COMMITTEE

Wayside provides both financial assistance and volunteer time to a number of outstanding charitable and community service providers in our area. We thought you might like to know more about them and the services they provide. The following are two of the organizations we are proud to support and we hope you will take more time to get to know them and possibly seek other ways to assist them in their service to the community.

Erie Home for Children and Adults – Paul Carpenedo (Director)
EHCA is celebrating its 100th anniversary in 2012. Our own Paul Carpenedo leads an organization whose purpose is to assist people with disabilities to live rich and fulfilling lives. Through 10 programs, EHCA serves over 300 people and their families every day throughout 4 counties: Erie, Crawford, Venango, and Potter. Since its humble beginnings as a temporary home for needy infants, the agency has evolved into 16 group homes providing specialized residential care for children and adults. The agency also offers community-based support services for individuals who live on their own or with their families.

Stairways Blended Case Management – Christine Colao-Nixon (Director)
The Case Management team at Stairways Behavioral Health provide child and adolescent assistance throughout Northwest Pennsylvania. Blended Case Management (BCM) is a community-based program providing direct care to people with special, complex needs. The aim of the Child & Adolescent Services division of BCM is to assure that children and adolescents who have or are at risk for developing a serious mental illness or emotional disorder get proper treatment and the supports necessary to help them succeed in the home, school and community. Services are tailored to assure clients receive the individualized attention they need as their circumstances and needs change.

March 4th Second Sunday in Lent/Celebration of Holy Communion

Text – Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

Title – “Living Legacy”

Just as the Bible recounts the covenant God made with Noah, now we find something similar: the promise God made to Abram and Sarai. Once again we are reminded that such promises of faithful relationship are initiated by God, not based on human merit or worth, with the great purpose of bringing blessing to all the earth.

March 11th Third Sunday in Lent

Text - Psalm 19

Title - “God: Our Imaginary Friend”

An article on children and how to teach them about God inspired the title. The psalmist uses images that spark the imagination as we seek to understand the God we can not see. How do we speak to children or adults for that matter of our invisible God?

March 18th Fourth Sunday in Lent

Text – Psalm 107:1-3, 17-22

Title – “Rich in Love”

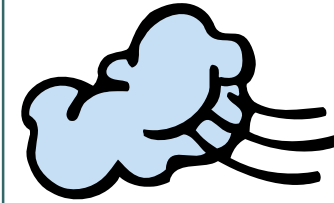
In Biblical times people wrestled with an ancient equation: that well being is a sign of God’s favor, while illness is a sign of God’s curse. It is an idea that dominates the book of Proverbs and other Hebrew Scriptures, including many of the Psalms. Our reading this morning, while acknowledging that approach, focuses instead on the restoration of those who have been victims of suffering: that it is God’s will for people to be healthy and whole.

March 25th Fifth Sunday in Lent

Text – Jeremiah 31:31-34

Title – “Heart Promises”

The Old Testament prophet Jeremiah is associated with “gloom and doom” and, to some degree, rightly so. His was a difficult, painful task, warning the people of the punishment that would follow their unfaithfulness. Yet Jeremiah, though fully aware of the power of human weakness and failings, never stopped believing that God’s love was stronger and would, in the end, prevail.
