Q & A

Should I worship on-site or continue with the online service at home?

Each of us needs to make the decision to worship onsite based on our own personal medical history. At this time, various national and state recommendations suggest that those in high risk categories as identified by the CDC should not worship onsite but should continue to worship online.

Will our FB Live, as well as YouTube, continue after we reopen?

We are committed to continuing our service online, as well as YouTube.

What do you mean when you say a Touchless Service?

*** As you enter the parking lot you will see people around our facility with signs of welcome, much like at the drivein! As you come to our outside doors, they will either be held open for you or possibly propped open. There will be no greeters at the doors and there will be no bulletin to pick up on the way in.

*** We are asking that the Connecting Area not be a "gathering place." Please, no hugs or handshakes. Do try to remember to observe the six foot of social distancing. Sorry, there will be no coffee or bagels offered but feel free to bring your own.

*** There will be signs on bathroom mirrors to remind you to turn water on and off with a paper towel and, of course, to wash your hands. Bathrooms will be limited to a family and will be cleaned after you exit for the next family.

*** The Worship Center will have a table on each side where you can find communion in plastic bags, as well as offering envelopes, and small bottles of water. If you need help with seating (the worship center will have a different seating arrangement) there are extra chairs in the back but do ask our usher to help you with moving chairs.

How has worship changed? What can we expect?

*** We plan to gather to praise the Lord in a way that will be familiar and comfortable for you. Our service will look much like the drive-in with a time of Praise/Thanksgiving to our Lord, followed by a Communion Mediation/Devotion. We will all partake in unison with the communion leader.

*** After communion, our Message and Closing Prayer will round out our service. All announcements will be on the screen and on our website at <u>www.communitychristian.cc</u>

*** Service length will be around 45 minutes for the first month, maybe 2.

Should I wear a mask?

***For the safety of others, especially high-risk individuals, it is recommended that masks be worn at all times within our building. We also understand masks get hot and uncomfortable. You may feel free to drop your masks for a couple of moments while you are sitting in the worship center.

*** All staff, leaders and volunteers have been asked to wear masks for your safety. Masks are strongly encouraged for those who plan to sing congregationally. If you do not have a mask, we can provide a mask for you.

Is the Building Cleaned Often?

The entire building is cleaned and sanitized during the week. In between services we will clean restrooms, wipe down hard surfaces that may be touched (handrails etc.) and chairs will be disinfected. (They will need about ten minutes to dry.)

What about Children?

Please realize children do not understand social distancing. As of this point in time, children will need to attend the service with parents. We do have for a sitting/changing room next to the main floor rest rooms [Room 207] for crying babies, for babies that need to feed, or babies that do need to be changed.
