

Background Check Policy

October 2009

Because we care for the safety and security of children at Community Christian Church, we require that anyone working with children under 18 in any capacity undergo a criminal background check.

- Anyone 18 or older who works with children under the age of 18 in any capacity must undergo a criminal background check.
- All background information is strictly confidential. The office manager [will process the paperwork. If no red flags are identified, the background check will be filed in a locked cabinet until a subsequent check is processed. All old documents will be shredded.
- 'Red flags' are any criminal behavior that might pose a risk for children including but not limited to: sexual deviancy, assault, domestic violence, etc.
- In the case of a 'red flag,' the Senior Minister, an elder, and the respective ministry leader [Student Minister or Children's Director] will have a conversation with the individual about the issue.
- A prospective volunteer is not automatically excluded due to a criminal history. The nature, severity and date(s) of the offense(s) will be taken into account. Each case will be treated individually.
- Anyone failing to complete a background check consent form will be unable to serve in a ministry that directly deals with children.
- Subsequent checks will be conducted every 2 years.
